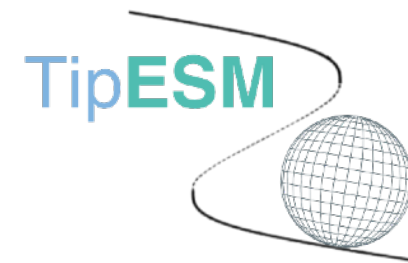

Task 9.3: Making TipESM Science Actionable



Science-policy co-production and translation:

i) knowledge mapping:

who is the most affected by crossing of each TP?



iv) discuss pathways to prepare for major impacts despite uncertainties in climate projections, identify remaining science gaps from a policy perspective.



ii) organize focus groups with stakeholders for co-production: what aspects matter to policy makers? Do we speak the same 'language'?

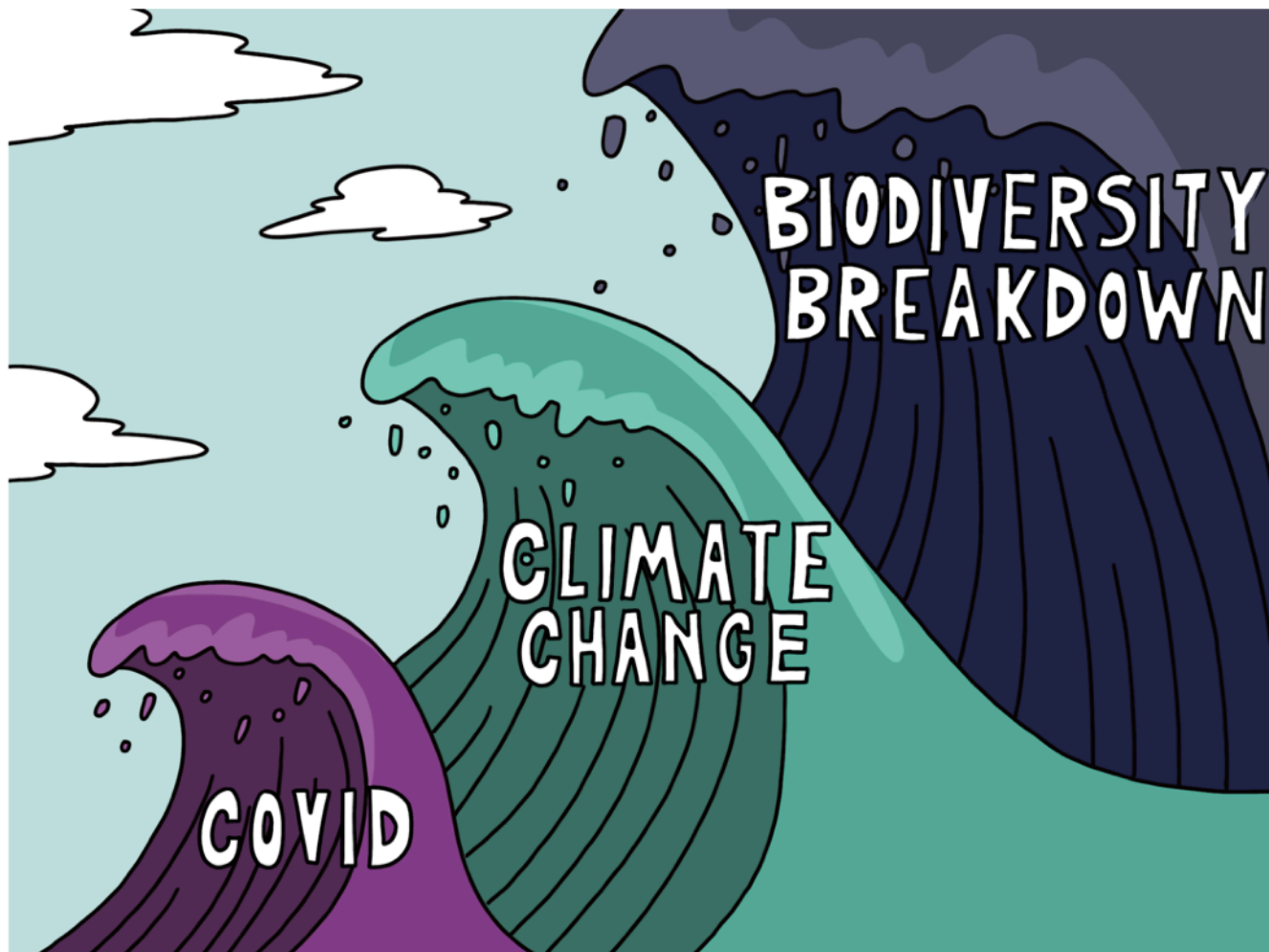
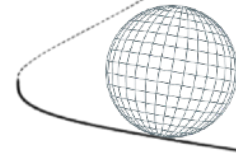


iii) form TipESM expert group to communicate findings to policy makers, stakeholders, journalists, etc.



v) organize interactive events at major governing bodies and agencies.



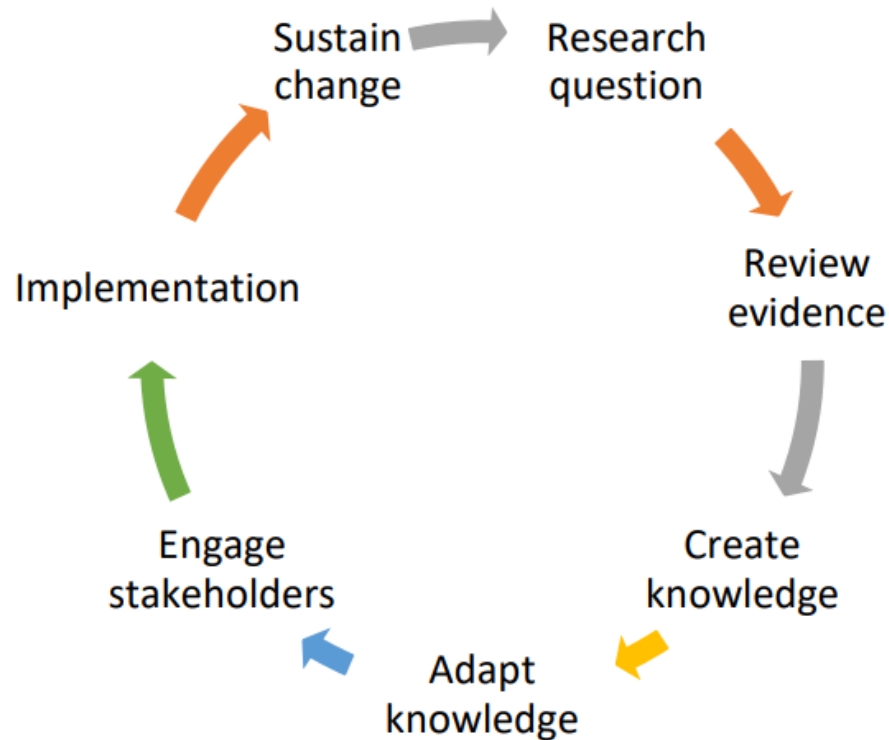


How do we discuss disastrous impacts of tipping points without alienating the audience?

Knowledge Translation

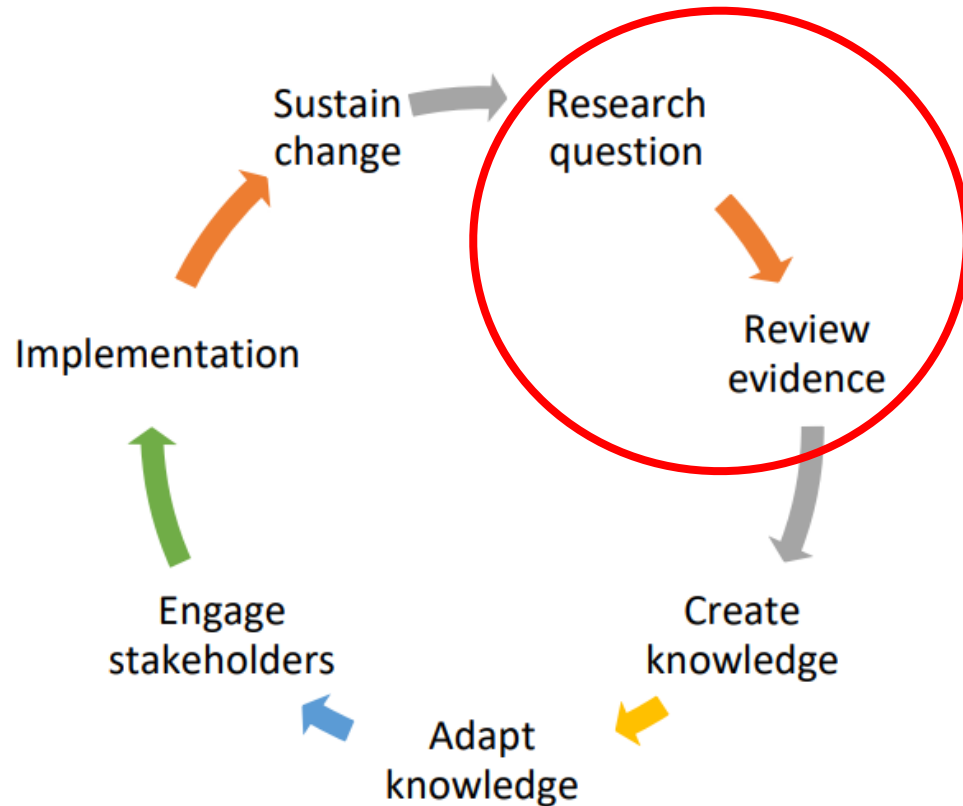


KT should take place throughout the research study, for example:

- Adapting knowledge for the local context.
- Engaging with stakeholders.
- Implementing research.
- Sustaining the change.

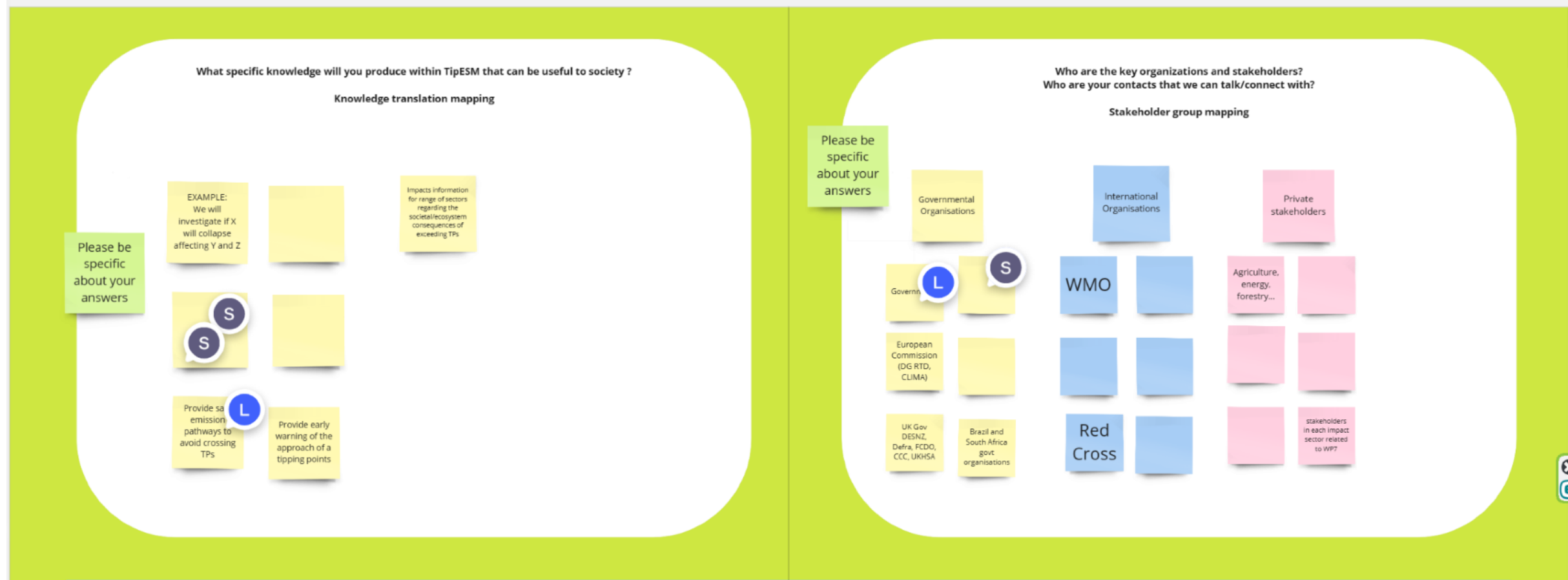
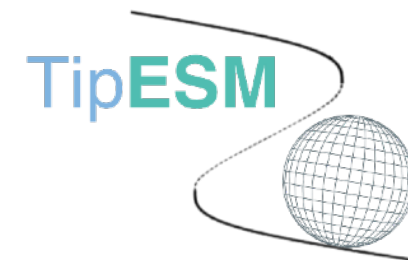
