



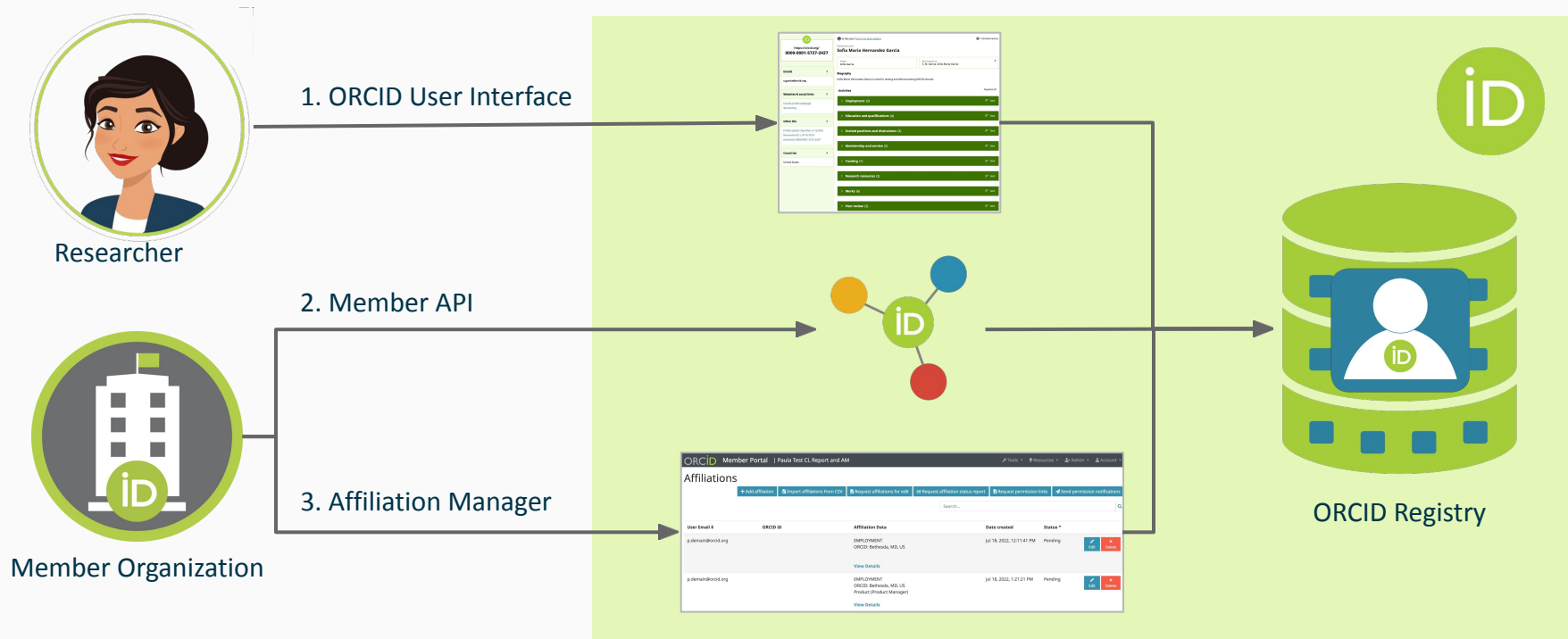

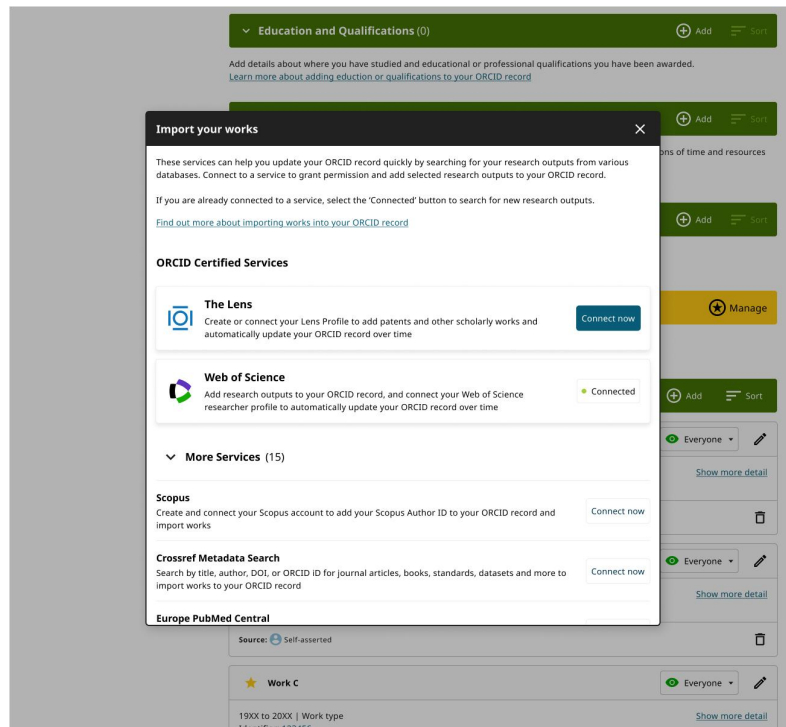



The source of the data is **“The researcher via the system”** as the researcher manually imported those works (or funding items).

# Data can also be added directly by member organizations creating a validated entry

When an ORCID member updates an ORCID record, the source (provenance) of that update is captured for re-use:



These provide **‘trust markers’** that can be used to help in decision making.
