What it does

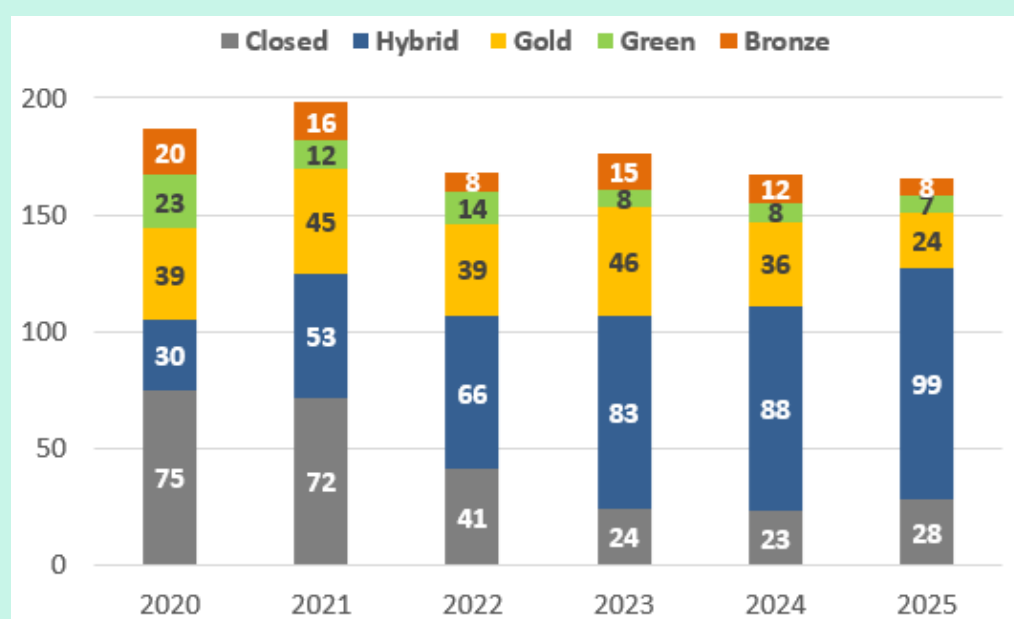
- Records all the works published by our researchers
- Preserves our collective intellectual production
- Shares publication details on the Institute's website
- Allows closed or restricted access as well as embargoes

Green Open Access

- Our librarians will include an open access manuscript with the record whenever possible
- This gives easier access to your publications, increasing their visibility, and fulfils your obligations towards your funder's open access mandate
- Contents are indexed in Google Scholar, Unpaywall, and Swisscovery, increasing your works' accessibility

Articles from our researchers

- The number of published articles is stable
- The share of open access has increased until 2023, but has since reached a plateau, a little over 80%
- Most open access publications were achieved in hybrid journals through read & publish agreements
- We should focus more on green open access

- Let us publish them under the rules and licenses set by your publishers
