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Question 1

What is the sum of 27 and 14?

Options:

Question 7

If there are 4 baskets, and each basket holds 6 apples, how many apples are there in total?

Options:

C. 10

D. 20

Answer: A

Explanation:

To find the total number of apples, multiply the number of baskets by the number of apples in each basket. So, 4 baskets \times 6 apples = 24 apples in total. This is a simple multiplication problem suitable for 2nd grade learners.

Question 8

Answer: B

Question 10

Answer: C

Explanation:
