




1 Context

- There is growing interest in making academic books open access (OA), with the **number of OA books increasing** each year along with the introduction of additional funder mandates.
- However, **limited awareness** amongst authors as well as a **lack of understanding** and common misconceptions about licensing and quality, form barriers in the transition to Open Access for books.
 - Within the context of open scholarship this calls for an **open resource** that is easy to use, kept up-to-date and relevant for researchers and research support worldwide.
- This has resulted in the concept of an **Open Access Books Toolkit**: making it easy for authors to find the information they need to publish their research as an open access book.
- The toolkit is going to be launched by the end of September 2020. The toolkit will be further developed over time with new resources based on **user feedback**.

2 What is it?



This toolkit consists of practical guidelines, helpful information and links to other resources around OA book publishing, gathered and curated by community experts. It will be a free-to-access resource to:

- Help authors better understand OA for books
- Support trust in OA book publishing
- Provide reliable and easy-to-find answers to questions from authors
- Provide guidance in the process of making a book open access


The toolkit will receive regular updates, carrying a timestamp for the last update on each page.

How is the OAPEN Open Access Books toolkit helpful for researchers?

The toolkit helps **past, current or prospective book authors** by answering questions around how to publish their research as an OA book. The toolkit takes authors to the right content they need, depending on where they are in the **research lifecycle**.

The toolkit covers different elements relevant to authors from different disciplines all around the world.
