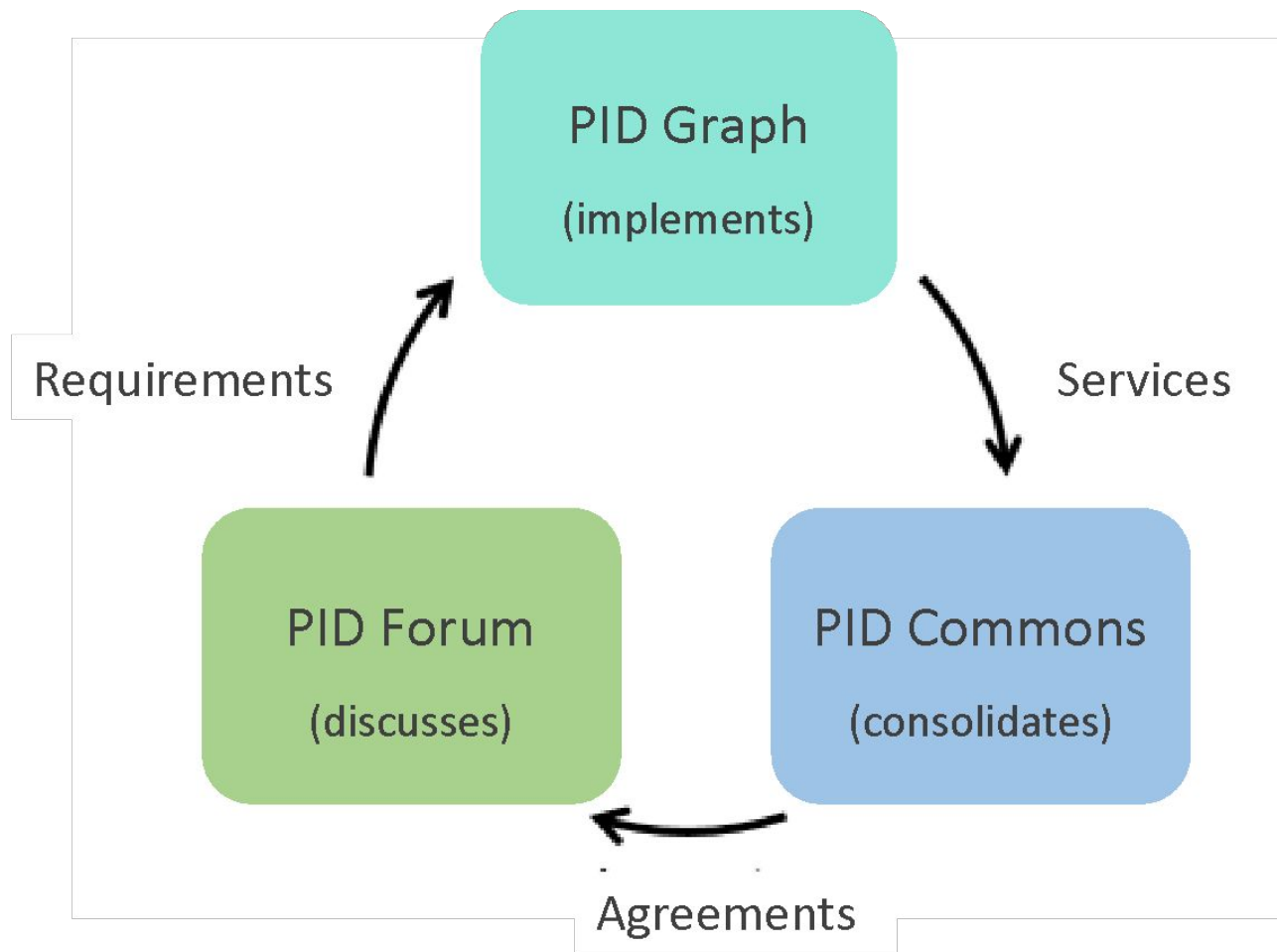

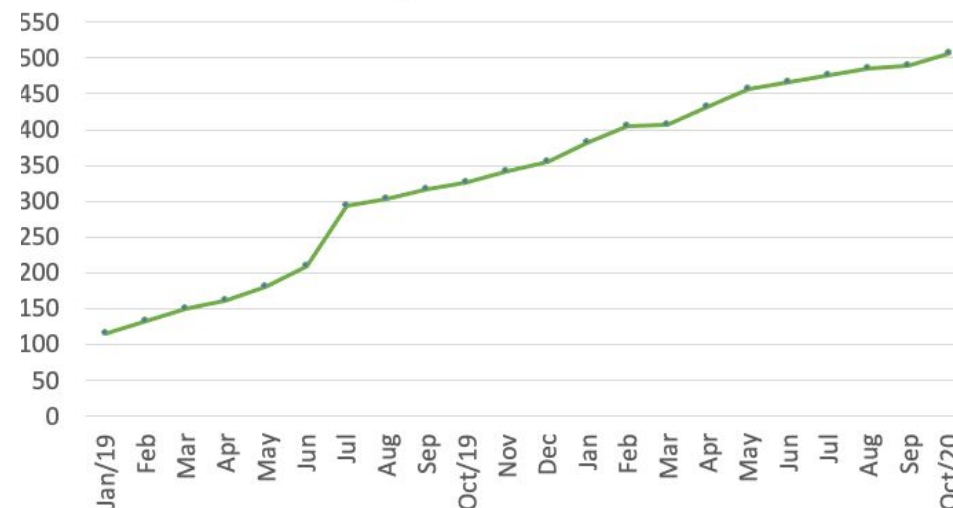

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The PID Forum was created by the FREYA project as one of its activities funded by the European Commission' Horizon 2020 programme (Grant Agreement number 777523).

The FREYA project is now coming to an end, but the FREYA team invited applications to continue operating and developing the PID Forum after the end of the project. Six applications were received, and an evaluation committee led by FREYA and consisting of current PID Forum moderators (excluding any affiliated with applicant organisations) conducted a systematic evaluation using criteria such as capability for technical hosting of the PID Forum, commitment to promotion and sustainability, and ideas for further development.

We are very pleased to announce that NISO, the National Information Standards Organization, has been selected to take over the PID Forum and continue it as a global resource. NISO is very engaged with the worldwide PID community and already helps with moderation for the PID Forum.

The FREYA team is very pleased that this valuable resource for the community will continue into the future.

Dear PID community,

[PIDforum.org](https://pidforum.org) has been a massive success in bringing together different stakeholders in the PID Community. Since the launch at PIDapalooza 2019, the PID Forum has grown to become an online space for exchange and discussion of everything to do with persistent identifiers with more than 450 users.

Can you help sustain the PID Forum in the future?

Currently, the PID Forum is managed and financed by the FREYA project. Since the project is ending in November of this year, a new host is needed.

FREYA partner DANS is the responsible organization currently hosting the PID Forum. The Forum runs on Discourse software under a "Business" payment plan ([see 10](#)) with a discount for educational institutions. The PID Forum currently has 15 moderators from several different institutions, who review the contents and channels and promote the Forum within their own communities.

We are looking for an organization that wants to run the PID Forum after November 2020. This includes both financing the PID Forum and providing moderation to sustain the community space that we have built together over the past two years.

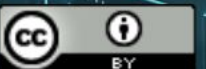

What is NISO?

- NISO develops technical standards for libraries, publishers and software providers.
- Create standards, recommended practices, host schemas, white papers, primers and other information resources
- Not-for-profit association, membership supported, community led consensus-development focused
- Operates both at US/national-level and at an international level

from the unfettered exchange of information*

NISO and PIDs

Did you know...?

- NISO supports the formalization of PID standards — from the ISSN and the DOI to the RAiD and beyond!
- NISO serves as the ISO Secretariat for the TC46/SC9 committee that standardized and maintains more than a dozen international identification standards
- NISO standards, recommended practices, and schema regularly incorporate PIDs
- NISO is now an official PIDapalooza partner, along with CDL, Crossref, DataCite, and ORCID

From FREYA to NISO

- FREYA subscription to the Discourse platform is paid through 10/21
 - No immediate technological changes planned
 - Look for improvements starting in Q2/Q3 2021
 - Likely moving to self-hosted site
 - Tell us what you want!
