# Who we are

We bring together **various stakeholders of quantitative survey research on the integration and/or inclusion of ethnic and migrant minorities (EMMs)**. For the purposes of executing our scientific work, we have organised ourselves into three distinct groups:



## Task 9.2 team of SSHOC

- Participates in and contributes to SSHOC on behalf of our data community
- Primarily coordinates and manages the scientific work undertaken by our data community, especially for the EMM Survey Registry



## ETHMIGSURVEYDATA

- An international network funded by the COST Association with more than 200 EMM-focused researchers from Europe and beyond
- Provides the intellectual impetus for the scientific work undertaken by our data community



## FAIRETHMIGQUANT

- An Open Science project funded by the French Agence Nationale de la Recherche (ANR)
- Ensures the inclusion of French surveys in the scientific work undertaken by our data community

# What we do

We are working to **make quantitative survey data on EMMs' integration and/or inclusion 'FAIR'** (Findable, Accessible, Interoperable, Reusable). As part of SSHOC, we have planned for **two deliverables**:

## FOCUS OF TODAY'S WEBINAR



**Launching the EMM Survey Registry: a free online tool that will display compiled survey-level metadata for over 1,000 quantitative surveys on EMMs' integration and/or inclusion from over 30 different European countries (Live in beta version)**



**Testing the feasibility of setting up, as part of the CESSDA-led European Question Bank (EQB), a component dedicated to EMM surveys identified via the development of the EMM Survey Registry (In progress)**

# A live 'census' of existing surveys

Surveys on EMMs' integration and/or inclusion are currently eligible to be included in the EMM Survey Registry if they **meet the inclusion criteria** below:



\* In some countries, surveys conducted prior to January 2000 were included.

\*\* The 35 countries correspond to those formally participating in [ETHMIGSURVEYDATA](https://ethmigsurveydata.eu).

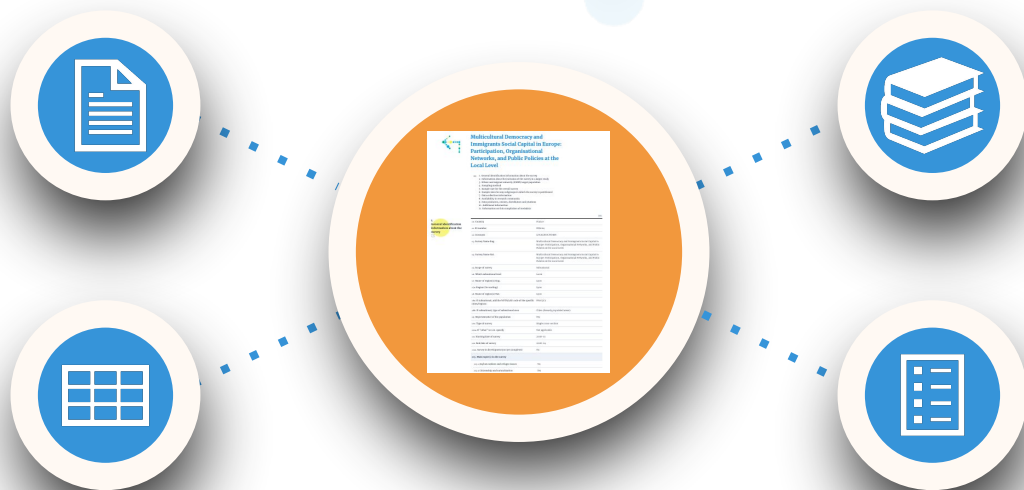
\*\*\* Sizeable is based on the achieved sample size of a survey; different sample size thresholds are in place depending on the country, the territorial coverage (national vs. subnational), and the target population of the overall survey (EMM-specific vs. general population).

# A single access point to quality information about the existing surveys

For each survey included in the EMM Survey Registry, **detailed, informative and structured metadata are compiled using existing resources\*** about the survey.

All metadata are then compiled using a [standardized procedure](#). They must also undergo a rigorous and multi-step [quality control process](#) in order to be **published and made freely accessible** on the EMM Survey Registry.

\*The metadata compiled for a survey includes information about the resources consulted, as well as information about how to access the survey's dataset(s), technical documentation, questionnaire(s), and/or other publications.





# User-friendly functionalities to easily discover and learn from the metadata

## EMM Survey Registry

The EMM (Ethnic and Migrant Minorities) Survey Registry is a database of quantitative surveys that have been undertaken with EMM (sub)samples across Europe and beyond. Survey-level metadata is available for each of the surveys included in the EMM Survey Registry. Explore and learn about the different surveys and find specific surveys using the search, filtering (simple and advanced) and sorting features. Once the desired filtering, sorting and/or search parameters have been identified/selected, the list of surveys will be automatically updated.

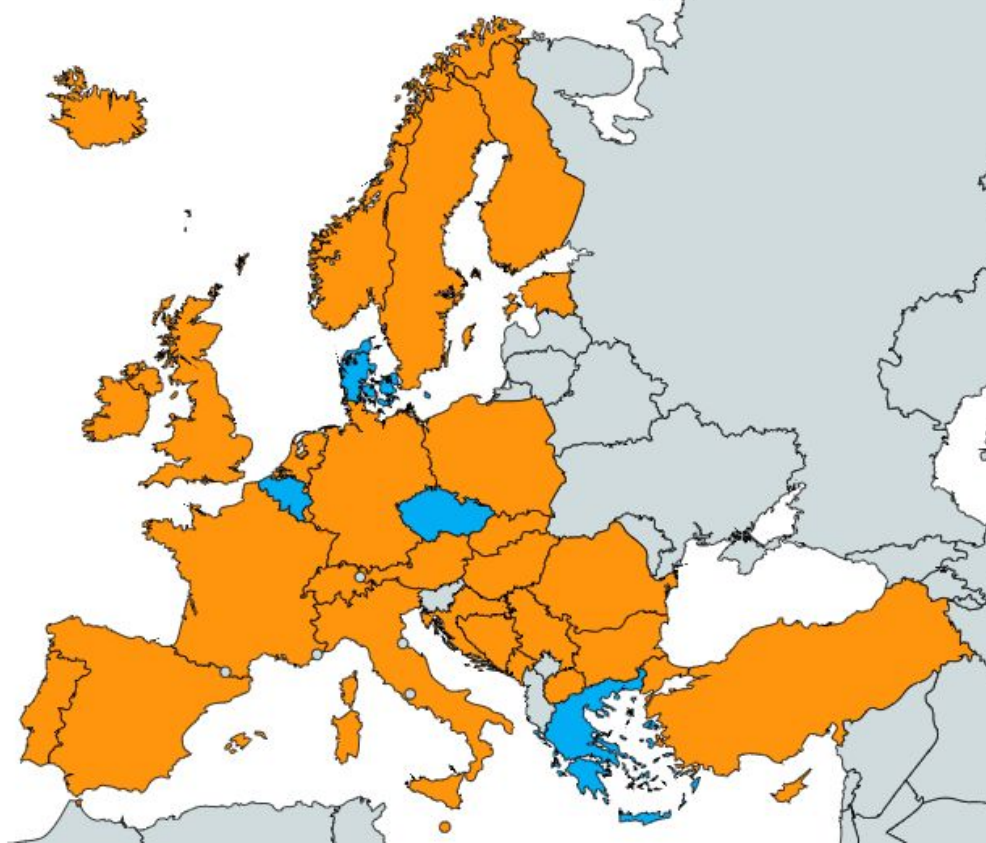

# The current metadata collection

The EMM Survey Registry currently **covers more than 1,300 surveys from 30 different countries** (see countries in **orange**). The metadata for these survey have largely been contributed by members of our data community.

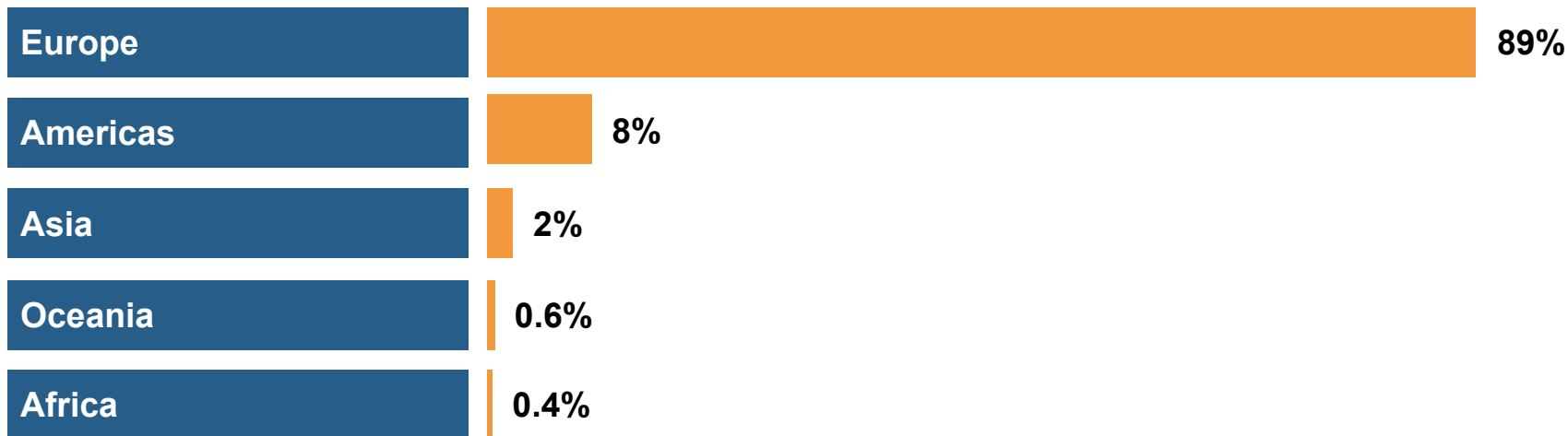
The metadata collection will continue to grow in the coming months, as **new countries are added** (see countries in **blue**) and **new surveys are contributed by data producers**.

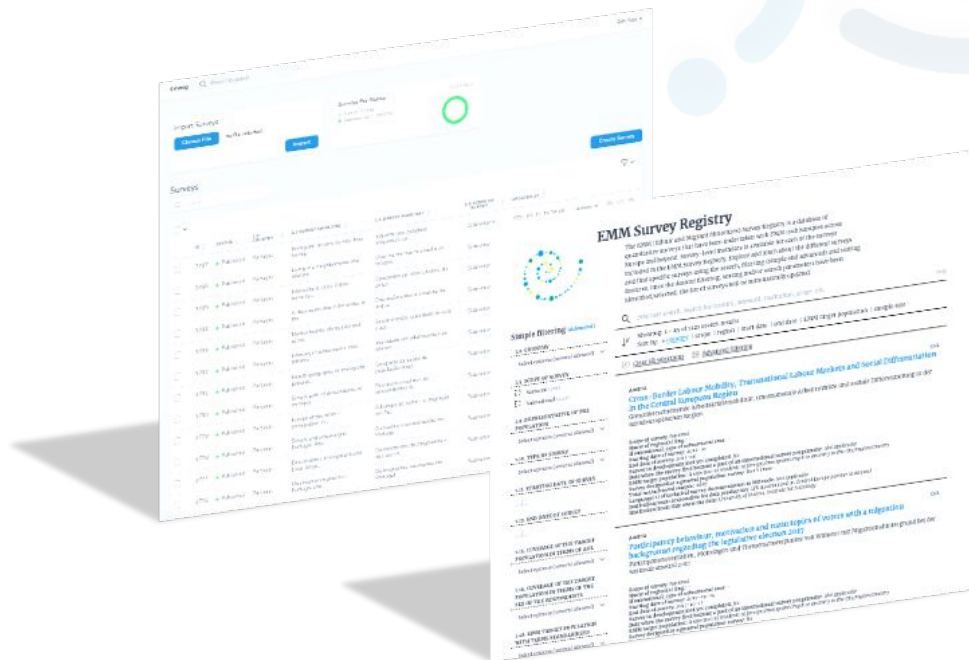

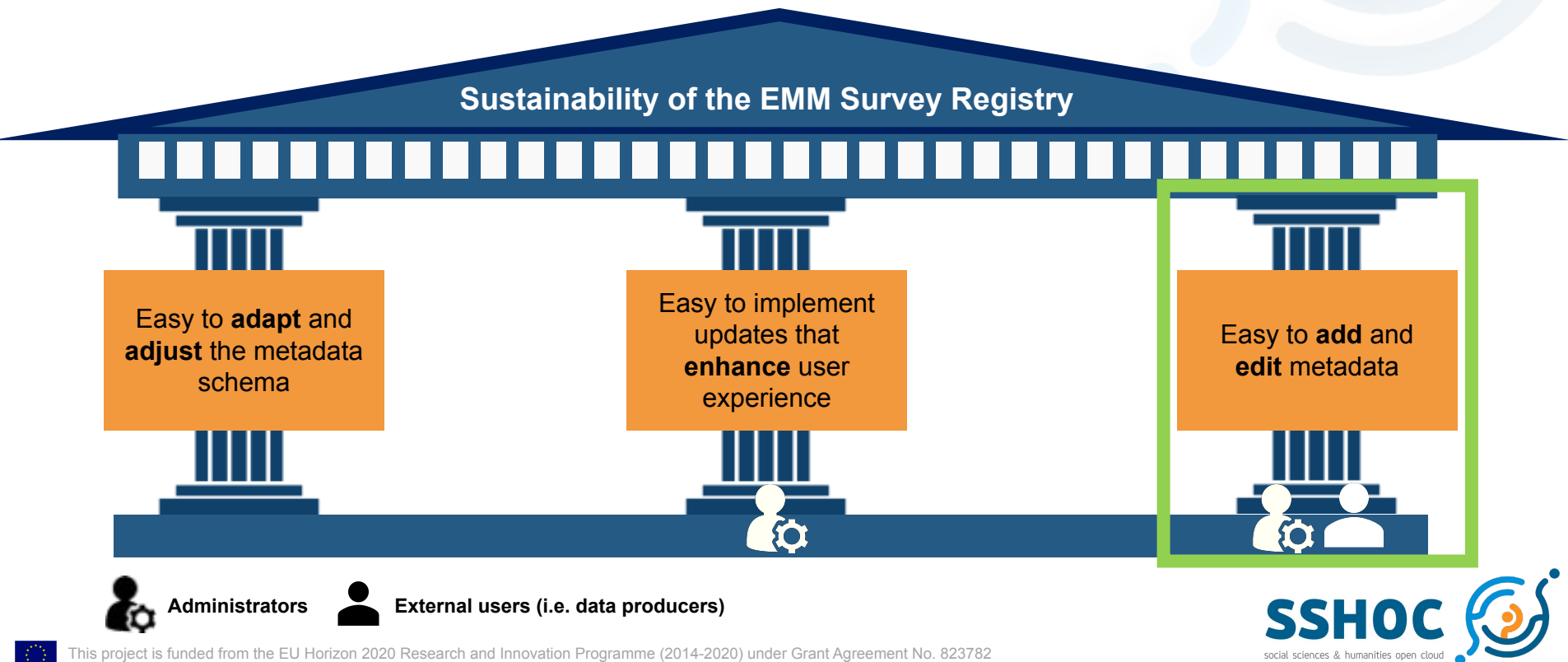


# Promoting sustainability via the back-end

# The role of data producers

## Metadata contributed by our data community

 **Surveys meeting** the aforementioned inclusion criteria

 **Metadata coded** using the **Excel-based** template

 **Metadata reviewed** via a **rigorous and multi-step** quality check process

## Metadata contributed by data producers

**New surveys meeting** the aforementioned inclusion criteria but **no longer limited** to the 35 countries

**Metadata coded** using an **online form** made available via the back-end

**Metadata reviewed** via a **rigorous and multi-step** quality check process

# The steps to contributing metadata as a data producer via the back-end

All data producers interested in contributing metadata will be **required to complete 3 steps**:

1

Carefully review the Conditions of use of the EMM Survey Registry and its metadata

2

Fill in and submit a form to request an account

3

Carefully read the user guide and watch the video tutorials explaining how to properly contribute metadata as a data producer

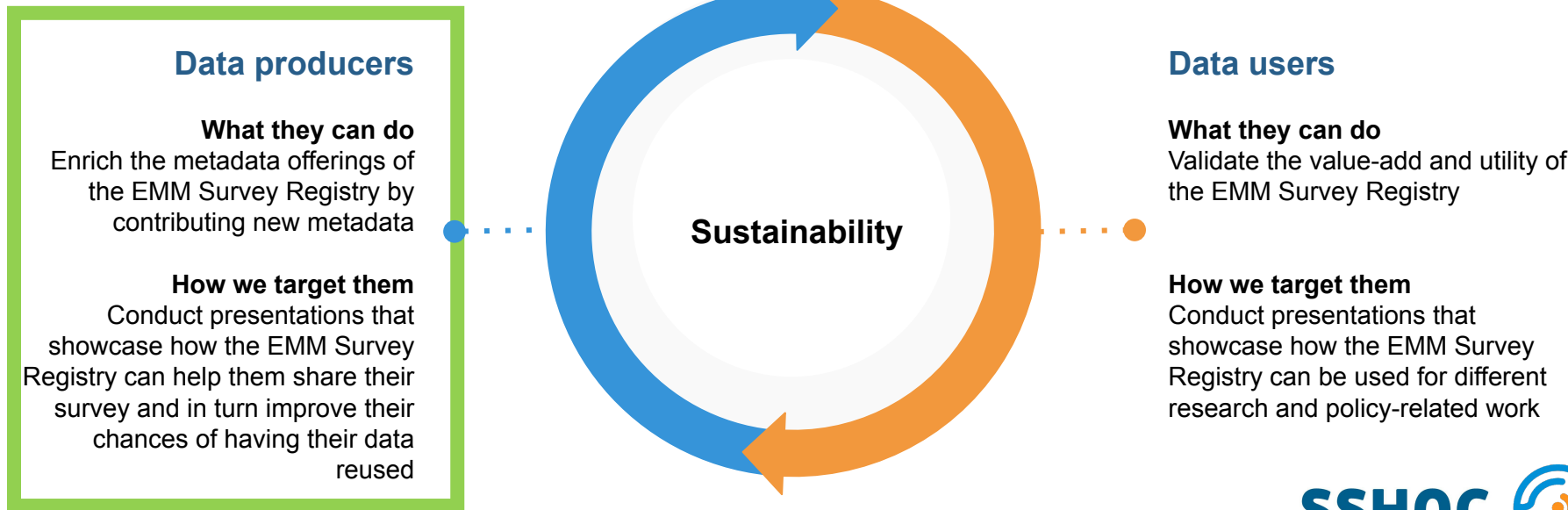

# Facilitating access to and re-use of COVID-19 surveys



A growing number of COVID-19 surveys have been undertaken with **EMM respondents**. These surveys can provide valuable insights about the COVID-19 experience of EMMs.

To improve access to and reuse of COVID-19 surveys with EMM respondents, the **EMM Survey Registry** has launched a **special COVID-19 collection**.

# Motivation and context for creating the EMM Survey Registry

Over the past 30 years, Europe has become an important **destination country for migrants** seeking to improve their life conditions or to escape from famine, persecution or war. A recent salient example is the the refugee inflow in 2014-2015.



European societies are **not socially homogeneous**: a range of groups have been formed based on linguistic, religious, national or racial elements of diversity. Some groups have become dominant with the nation-state, while others have become the **minority**.


**EU institutions and member states** are therefore interested in obtaining **informative** and **reliable indicators** of **EMMs' integration**.



# Motivation and context for creating the EMM Survey Registry (cont.)

There **remains an unused potential in EMM survey data** because these data are often **difficult to find, access, and reuse**.

Researchers continue to **face distinct challenges when surveying EMM populations**. Four challenges stand out: (1) sampling, (2) (non)response, (3) mode of interviewing and (4) trust in researchers or data-collectors.



To facilitate access to and quality of knowledge on the inclusion and integration situation of EMMs in the various economic, social and political domains of public life across Europe and its neighbouring countries, the ethnic and migration studies data community decided to create the EMM Survey Registry, a free online tool that would be FAIR and would display survey-level metadata about existing quantitative surveys to EMMs.

# Methodology we used for compiling and producing metadata

Given the objectives of the EMM Survey Registry, the following **methodological decisions and protocols** were implemented:



## Delimiting the scope

To be included, a survey had to be quantitative and sample-based, focusing on at least one dimension of EMM integration. It also had to meet certain sample size criteria



## Defining the search process

To homogenise how countries looked for surveys, a detailed document with specific search guidelines was produced and used by all participating parties



## Documenting the metadata

Each country was instructed to fill out metadata about each identified survey using an Excel-based template with over 200 metadata variables



## Establishing quality checks

A multi-stage and rigorous version control process was designed to be applied to all the compiled metadata in every country

# Adopting the FAIR principles

The EMM Survey Registry has been **designed and developed to promote and align with the FAIR principles** in the following ways:



## Findable

- Easier to locate surveys, as the EMM Survey Registry is like a 'census' of existing surveys
- Easy to navigate information (i.e. metadata) about each survey due to the user-friendly interfaces (front and back-end) and the systematic documentation of the information (via a metadata schema)



## Interoperable

- Metadata is set up so that they can be easily shared with humans
- Metadata is also set up so that they can easily be shared with machines (primarily other social sciences data archives and repositories)



## Accessible

- Metadata about each survey is made publicly available online
- Metadata about each survey specifies how to access the data set(s), technical documentation, questionnaire(s), and other relevant publications



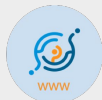
## Reusable

- Metadata is detailed, informative and structured; metadata itself can be used for research
- Reuse of the survey is facilitated since the metadata includes information about how to access the relevant original sources (e.g. data set(s), technical documentation)
