Learning new words in context. This technique is effective in memorizing polysemantic words or set expressions. As an example, the author considers the word fair: “If, for example, the word “fair” is encountered, and it means “fair”, but this does not fit the context, then I give the phrases a fair mark - a fair assessment, a fair price - a fair price, a fair weather - favorable weather, a fair boy - a blond boy”.

For example, from a synonymous series of words, one should learn those words that correspond to the level of the student: “In grades 5-6, it is enough to know the meaning of the word noisy - noisy: a noisy boy, a noisy town.
