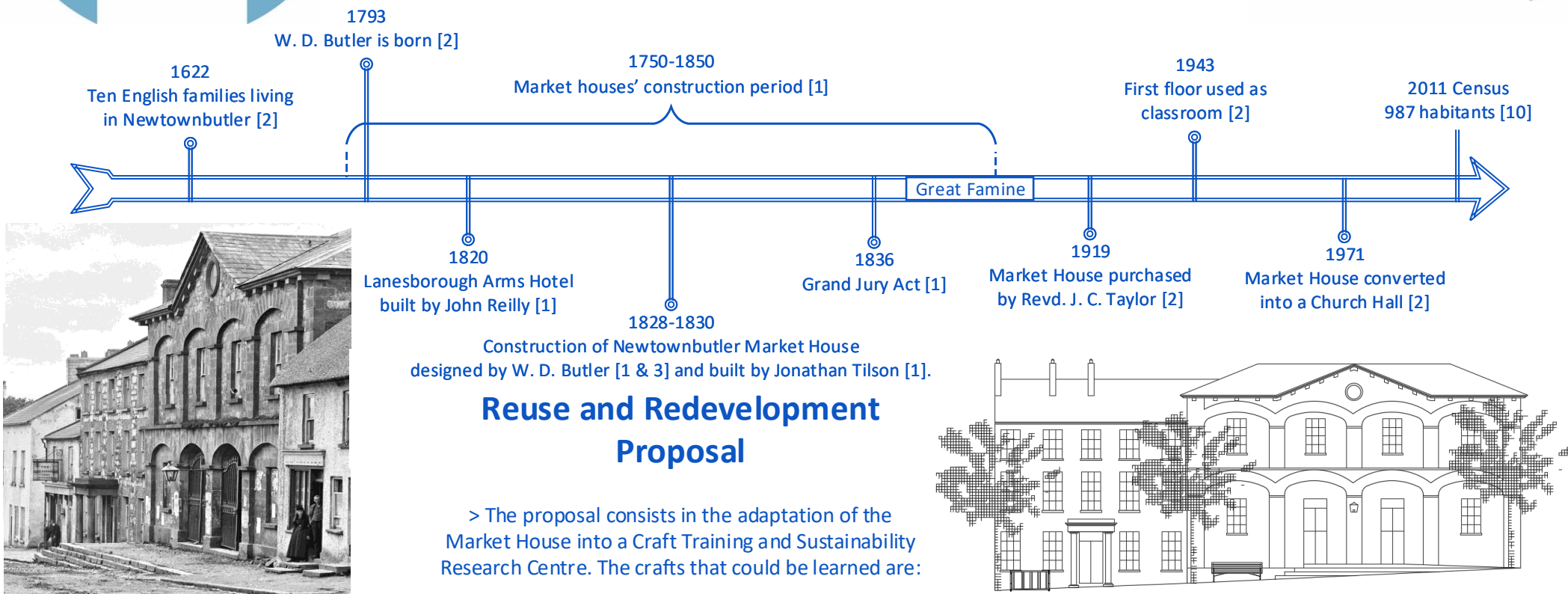




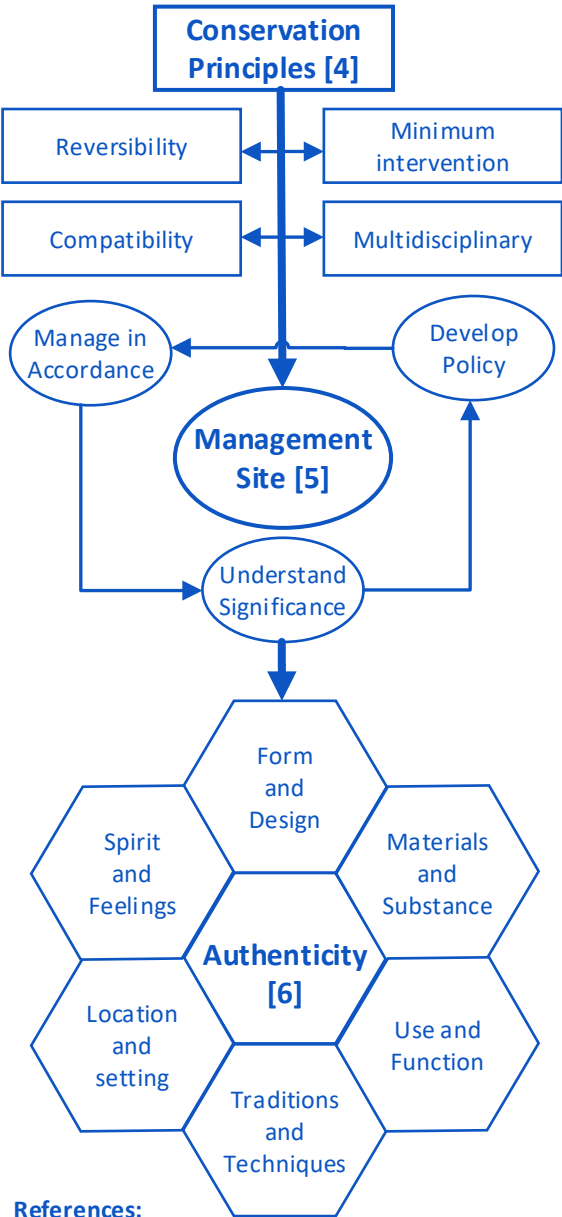

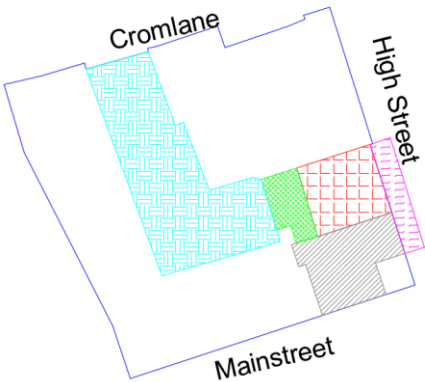
The space would host a permanent exhibition of the history and importance of Irish market houses (with a special section on the history of Newtownbutler's Market House and Lanesborough Hotel) and a library with material specialized in craftsmanship and sustainability topics open to all public.

> The Hotel would be part of the adaptation and would offer accommodation for tourists, accommodation for participants and spaces for lecturing/presentation of the workshops.

> The buildings located at the back of the Hall would be used as storage for tools and specialized equipment.

> The open area would allow the delivery/removal of material and would also be used to facilitate the practical workshops.

> Finally, the urban intervention would consist in the recovery of the symmetric façade and traditional street lamp, the adaptation of the sidewalk for universal access to the new Centre, the planting of trees to improve the townscape aesthetics, the installation of a bike's rack to promote the use of the bicycle both for local mobility and for tourism purposes, and finally, the installation of a bench, element typical in villages for informal meeting point.
