the shape and approximate dimensions of each separate parcel, also the position of any drainage reserves. Upon the decision of the application, one copy shall be returned with the approval of the Council noted thereon.

Before the subdivision is effected, the Applicant shall also furnish to the Council, the plan to be lodged at the Registrar-General's Office, or a copy thereof for notation as provided in the previous sub clause and also a copy to be retained by the Council.

10c. To have the following addition—Provided that where the roads are not constructed before the subdivision takes place, as provided for in Section 328, the top of the mark may be placed flush with the natural surface of the ground. The Applicant shall also deposit with the Surveyor-General such fees as shall be prescribed to cover the cost of the subsequent placing of the marks in the correct position, and shall produce the receipt for same to the Council before the Council Clerk's Certificate shall issue. On the completion of the road, the Council Clerk shall notify the Surveyor-General, who shall thereupon take steps to have the marks placed in the correct positions.
