The author is pastor of the Erie Avenue Baptist church, Williamsport, Pa., and a man of extensive experience in dealing with the juniors for whom the contents of this book were especially prepared and to whom they were delivered as illustrated talks. Forty-eight topics are presented in a simple and graphic manner for the assistance of parents, Junior leaders, Sunday school teachers and pastors. The range of subjects is wide and the blackboard is constantly called into requisition. The treatment is often unique, sometimes a bit fanciful, yet always concrete and attractive.

Sparks From a Superintendent's Anvil. By A. T. Schauffler, D.D. W. A. Wilde Co., Boston and Chicago. Price \$1.00.

The name of the author is a guarantee of sane and practical thinking and pointed and vigorous expression.

Dr. Schauffler does not in this volume attempt a logical or consecutive treatment of Sunday school principles and problems, hence such a discussion must not be expected. However, we do find *sparks* that fly fast, burn brightly and strike in every direction. Live wires run through every page.

Book I of the volume treats of The Book or What We Teach, in eight chapters; Book II, The Scholar or Why We Teach; Book III, The School or How We Teach.

Eight of the total twenty-five chapters are written by seven of the leading Sunday school writers of our country. The volume is a medley, but one that stirs to noble deeds.

Each of several chapters is worth the price of the book, e. g., Some Defects of Modern Child Study, The Early Conversion of Scholars, Graded Lessons, etc. The wise, strong words are needed just now, even though one may not fully agree with the position of the author.
