

**5.) The Biological Laboratory  
of the Brooklyn Institute of  
Arts and Sciences.**

The Laboratory will be open from June to September with regular instruction from June 26<sup>th</sup> to August 6<sup>th</sup>. The number of students and investigators is limited to fifty. — Instruction is offered in Field Zoology by Drs. Walter and Davenport; in Ornithology by Mrs. Walter; in Comparative Anatomy by Prof. H. S. Pratt; in Animal Bionomics and Evolution by Dr. Davenport; in Cryptogamic Botany by Dr. York; in Eugenics by Dr. Davenport in connection with the Eugenics Record Office.

Evening lectures and excursions are provided and facilities for independent investigators are also afforded.

**6.) Puget Sound Marine Station.**
