

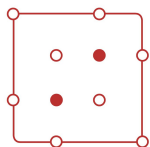

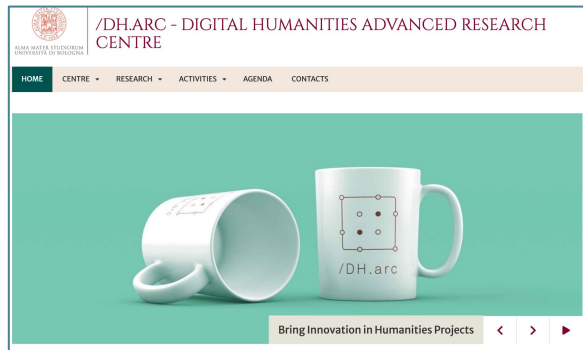

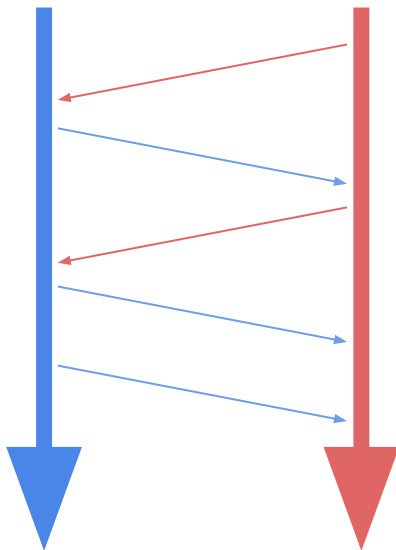

The **international** degree programme in Digital Humanities and Digital Knowledge (DHDK) offers a **cross-disciplinary** curriculum designed to foster close connections between humanities and the sciences of representation and processing of information and knowledge

Three macro-areas of learning:

- **Computer Science**
- Literary, linguistic, historical/cultural and related to the arts in the digital context
- Complementary: economy, law and communication

Programming principles and languages
Data modelling and multimedia database design
Design and creation of web application and interface management
Extraction and representation of data
Production of multimedia applications in a cultural heritage context

E.g.: Computational Thinking and Programming

Goal: introducing essential and practical aspects of Informatics – namely **algorithms**, **data structures**, and **algorithmic techniques** – to students in the Humanities with **no prior knowledge** of them

Notions of Python are briefly introduced – however Python is not the main focus of the course: it is just a tool, i.e. a formal **language**, adopted to **communicate** with and **instruct** an information-processing agent

Learning a programming language is **like learning a new language**: students need to practice it (a lot) to master it properly

Concepts such as **abstraction**, **trial-and-error** learning, **prior experience**, deriving **general principles**, **practice**, are key factors when learning a new language

spot meetings (2 hour each) with tutors to address exercises from the theoretical part

basic course (15 lectures of 2 hours each) - mainly theoretical notions

laboratory (6 lectures of 2 hours each) - learning Python basics

Each lecture includes a brief description of a “historic hero” who is functional to the lecture to show that essential aspects such as computation, data structures, recursion can be found in **everyday life** and in places in which they are not usually expected to be

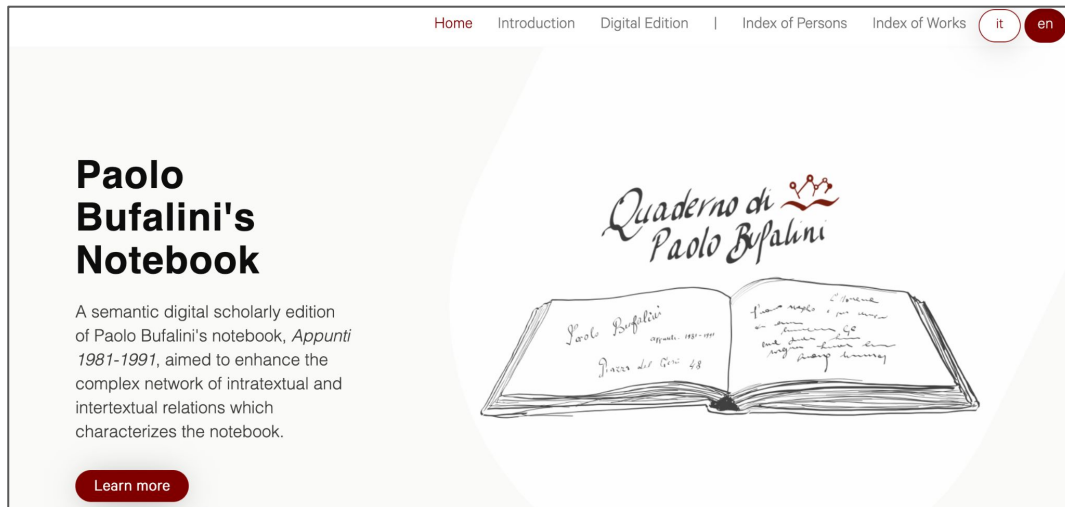
Description

it Paolo Bufalini (Roma, 1915-2001), politico e partigiano italiano, fu tra i massimi protagonisti della politica italiana del secondo dopoguerra. Laureato in giurisprudenza, ricoprì posizioni dirigenziali nel Partito Comunista Italiano, fu membro del Parlamento e Senatore della Repubblica ininterrottamente dal 1963 al 1992. Parallelamente alla carriera politica, Bufalini coltivò il proprio interesse per i classici e, soprattutto, per la letteratura latina. Particolarmente apprezzate sono le sue traduzioni delle odi di Orazio

Semantic Digital Edition of Bufalini's notebook

Between 1981 and 1991, Paolo Bufalini keeps a private notebook with his own thoughts and those of other writers

The Semantic Digital Edition (SDE) is an **extension** of the original digital edition (TEI/XML) with **RDF technologies**, to enrich available information with data extracted from external sources

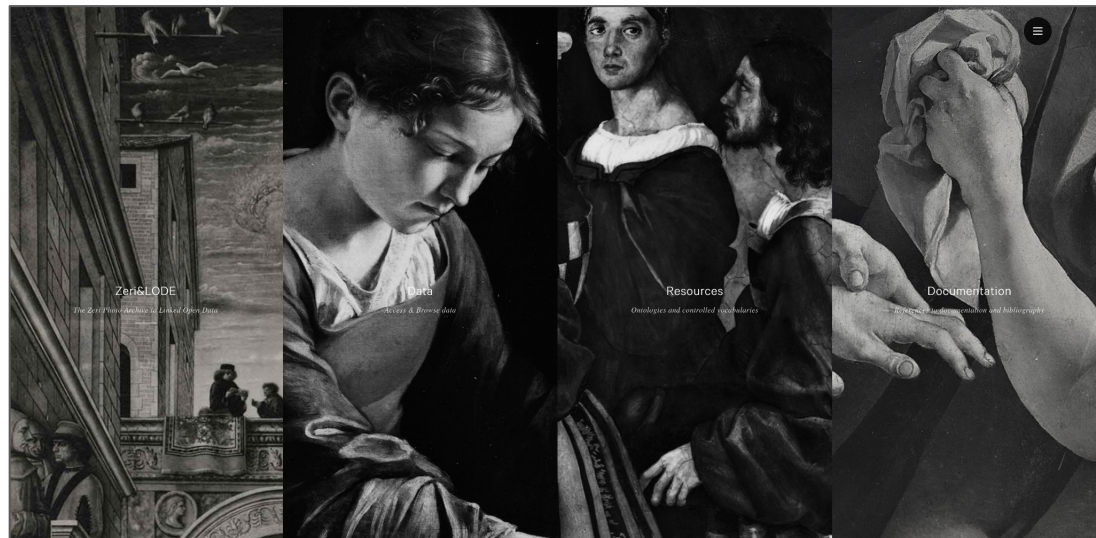

Mapping the descriptive elements used in the current Zeri Photo Archive catalog into RDF, converting into CIDOC CRM and into the two new aforementioned ontologies

OpenCitations

OpenCitations (<http://opencitations.net>) is an independent not-for-profit infrastructure organization dedicated to open scholarship and the publication of open bibliographic and citation data by the use of Semantic Web (Linked Open Data) technologies

It provides:

- a data model: the OpenCitations Data Model (more later)
- bibliographic and citation databases (CC0) – main collection is OpenCitations Indexes, including more than 1.29 billion citation links
- software available in GitHub repository (<https://github.com/opencitations>) released with open source licenses
- online services: REST APIs, SPARQL endpoints, dumps, interfaces

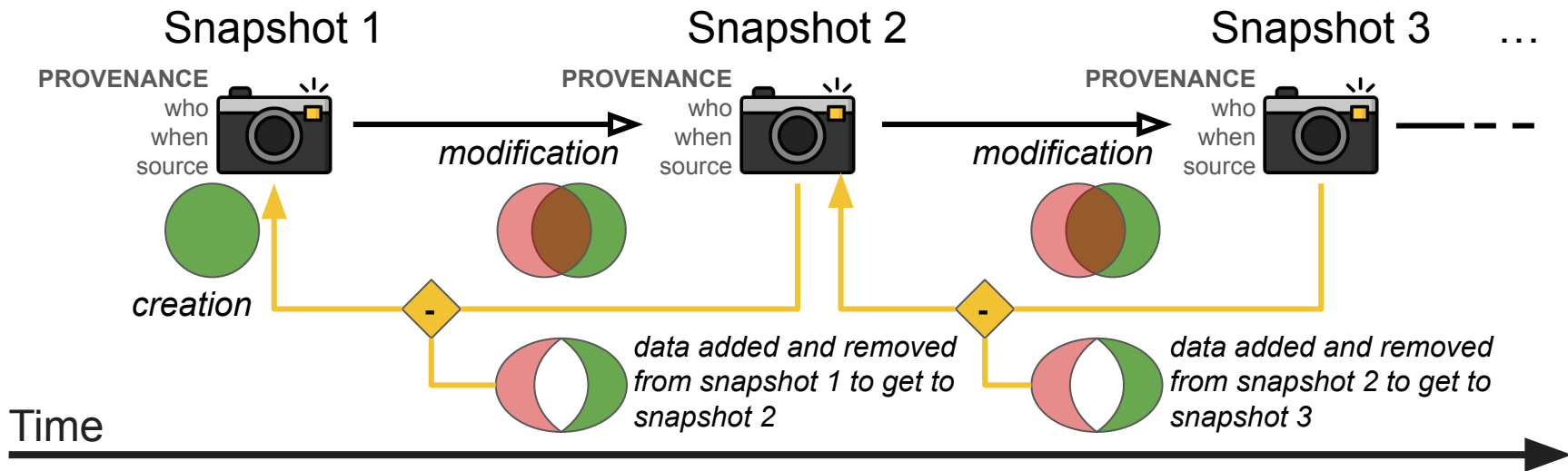

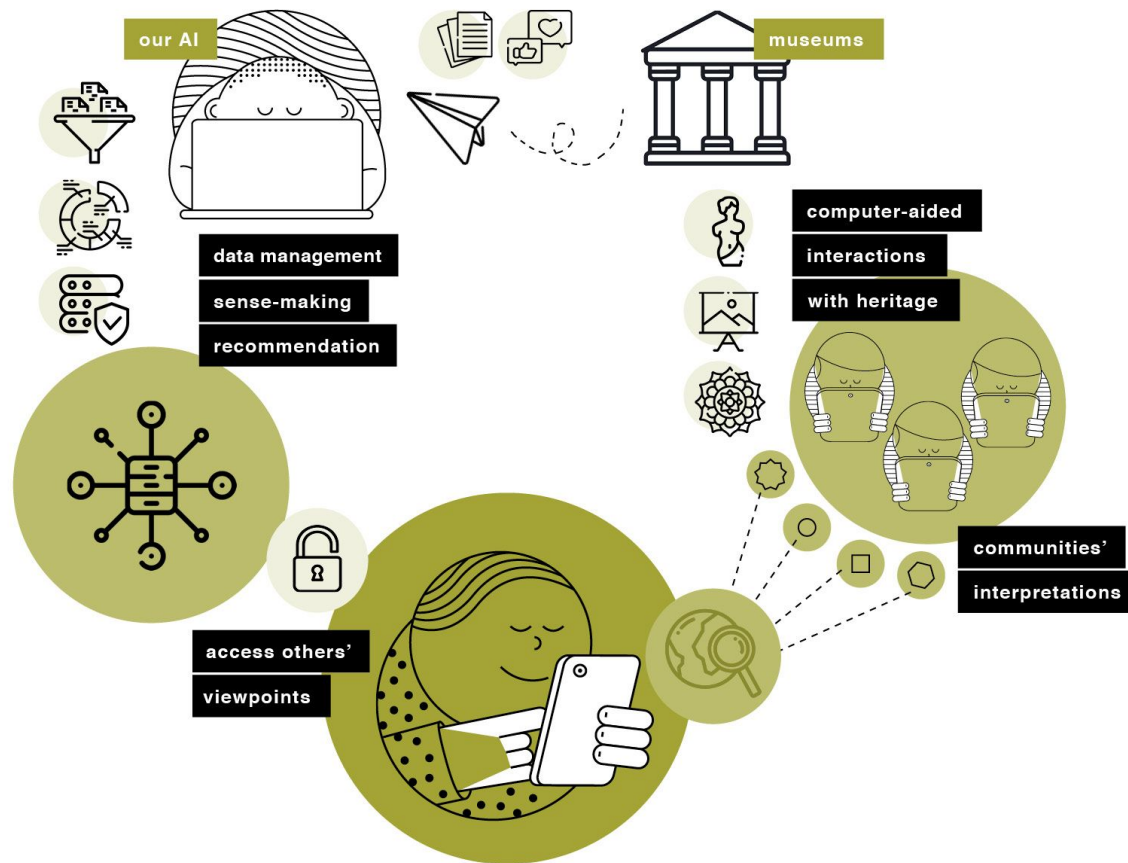
To keep track of the history of an entity we need to store all the data of its last snapshot plus all the deltas built by modifying the previous snapshots

SPICE (Social cohesion, Participation, and Inclusion through Cultural Engagement) is an EU Horizon 2020 funded project

Goal: developing technologies that help communities select paintings, artefacts and other museum objects and share their interpretations with others → Citizen Curation

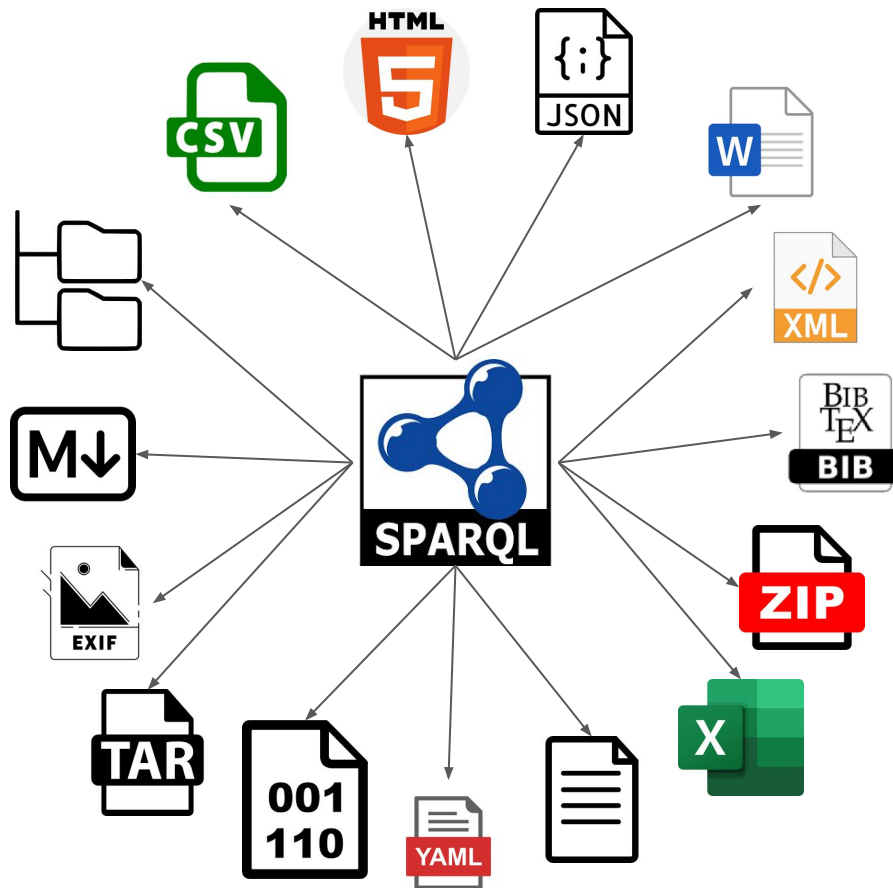


SPARQL Anything

SPARQL Anything is a system for Semantic Web re-engineering that allows users to query anything with SPARQL

- SELECT queries, to get some data out of the particular source
- CONSTRUCT queries, for data conversion into RDF data

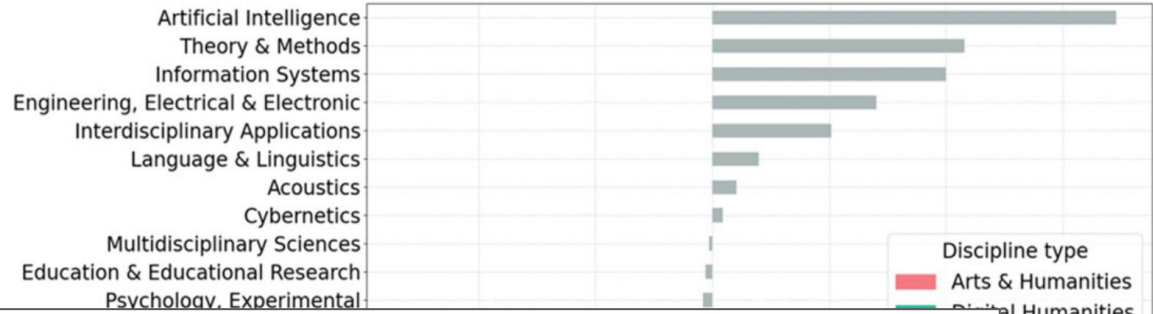

What are DH?

A study to measure the coverage of DH publications in mainstream bibliographic data sources

DH publications act as a bridge between SSH disciplines – e.g. Linguistics, Psychology, and Pedagogical & Educational Research, that cite DH research – and Computer Science – that is cited mainly by DH research

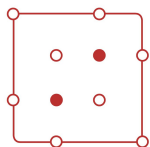
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
