#### Information Sheet

Purpose of the Study. I am Dr Catherine Ferris, <u>IReL</u> Open Scholarship Officer (Maynooth University) and Project Manager of the National Open Access Monitor Project, funded by the National Open Research Forum.

This project will develop a monitor for open access at the national level, initially through pilot reports and a national dashboard to publish, analyse and track progress towards 100% open access. The key objectives and expected outcomes are to:

- · Work to arrive at a community-agreed definition for Open Access at the national level
- Build on previous NORF work, engaging with national stakeholders (DFHERIS, NORF, NORF 2022
  Open Research Fund projects, HEA, research funding organisation, research performing
  organisations, national research infrastructures, publishers etc.) to gather and validate user
  requirements for Open Access monitoring
- Work with external vendors to deliver reports and a national dashboard to help Ireland publish, analyse and track open access rates at the national level.
- Document challenges that should be addressed in long-term monitoring solutions and recommend steps to be taken, including workflows for data validation and enrichment.
- Work to improve the quality and depth of data used for the national dashboard in line with international best practice through stakeholder collaboration with institutions, funders etc. and direct input or validation where possible.
- Following NORF and Science Europe recommendations, ensure that the monitor uses data and bibliographic databases that are openly accessible, is built using open infrastructure, and is publicly accessible to view and analyse.

### What will the study involve and what information will be collected?

Participants will be asked to provide input and contribute as representatives of stakeholder entities, over the course of the two-year project (1 November 2022-1 November 2024), in the following areas:

- to arrive at a community-agreed definition for Open Access in this context at the national level
- to validate, and if required expand on, the user stories and functional requirements of the National Open Access Monitor identified by the NORF OA Monitoring Policy Brief Group. These functional requirements should explicitly state current OA reporting metrics for each stakeholder, required data points and potential future requirements.
- to monitor and track the costs associated with contributing to this project and to
  provide this data to the Project Manager, for inclusion in the final report to the funder,
  in a pseudonymised format (to the high-level stakeholder group) to demonstrate the
  cost of this work to the national research system.
- to provide metadata and persistent identifiers as required, to enable the successful delivery of the pilot dashboard
- to provide feedback on the pilot dashboard
- if necessary, to work with the Project Manager to determine the impact of vendor nondeliverables
- to work with the Project Manager to identify gaps, incomplete representation, or errors in pilot data.
- to work to improve the quality and depth of data used for the national dashboard.
