


From Cataloguers to Designers:

Cataloguer – a person who makes a systematic list of items (of the same type)

- *The world as it is*

Designer – A person who plans the look or workings of something prior to it being made, by preparing drawings or plans

- *The world as it could be*



Paul Otlet (1868-1944)

- Father of Information Science
- Creator of Universal Decimal Classification
- Originator of Universal Bibliography project
- Founder of Union of International Associations
- Influencer of League of Nations, UN and Unesco





"What was of primary importance for the positivist philosopher was the formation of a 'subjective synthesis' of positive knowledge as a way of envisaging and directing the development of society"



- Opponent of Deutsche Freiheitsbibliothek 1934







? Sensemaking – policy, strategy, decisions, risk, opportunity





Sequestration:

- the act of separating people from other people or things.










To Make a Difference:

- We need an unembarrassed ethical stance
- We need to recognise the wider impact of our work and make ourselves accountable for consequences arising from our work
- We need to move from a passive “service” stance to an activist “design” stance
- We need to acquire and build skills in:
 - Design (service, tools, apps, infrastructure)
 - Business analytics (purpose)
 - User needs analysis
 - Technology toolsets and capabilities
 - Sensemaking from diverse and large information and data sets
