How do you Compose your Literary Corpus or Literary Collection?

The goal of this survey is to know more about how researchers in literary studies design their research object (corpus or collection) when studying literary texts.

For example, **a project analyzing French novels written by French female writers in the 19th century** uses information about:

- the author (gender, nationality)
- and the work (original language, genre, year of first publication)

More specifically, we aim to know about which categories are used as criteria for the composition of both digital and non-digital collections of texts.

In this survey, we understand *research objects of literary texts*, *literary corpus*, and *literary collection* as broad synonyms.

Why do we do this?

First, to obtain a clearer picture about the praxis of composition of the research object in (digital) literary studies. Second, to make research infrastructure more useful for researchers. A more exact picture of how literary scholars compose their research object (either printed or digital) can help infrastructure institutions (libraries, institutions curating authority files) and projects (ERICs, NFDI) to know how to develop their tools, repositories and catalogs in a way that meets the community necessities.

When resources have the metadata that the community uses as criteria, the task to create new research objects of literary texts (corpora or collections) will be easier.

Who is doing this survey?

This survey has been prepared and launched by the Text+ Consortium, the priority program Computational Literary Studies (SPP-CLS) and the European project Computational Literary Studies Infrastructure (CLS INFRA). In its preparation, the feedback of several other scholars unrelated to the previously mentioned projects has been considered.
