





- Advocacy campaign and materials





What institutions and libraries can do

- Build your own knowledge-base and understanding
- Source legal support: locally, nationally and internationally
- Raise awareness of rights retention & open licensing policy
 & practice
- Provide support to authors and editors of local journals
- Initiate policymaking and/or support the process
 - O Institutional to support all local authors, and local journals
 - O Negotiate with publishers (as libraries or as consortia)
- Monitor the imp. of related policies in institutions

The Open Access Books Network (OABN) brings together a community of people interested in all aspects of Open Access books.








What we do










SCOSS map (in progress) - technical connections
