Open Licensing

What is an open license?



A license

grants permissions and states restrictions

AN OPEN LICENSE

grants permissions to access, reuse and redistribute work

with few or no restrictions.

Open Licensing

Openly licensed work is free to be shared, improved and built upon!¹

Free to be:

- ✓ Printed/shared,
- ✓ Altered,
- ✓ Incorporated,
- ✓ Used for another work, etc.

The permissions depend on the full text of the open license that is applied.¹

Open Licensing

From history

[GNU Free Documentation License](#) - 2000^{2,4}

[David Wiley](#): [Open Publication License](#) (OPL) released in June 1999²

- first formal non-software open license²

[Larry Lessig](#) – Creative Commons,

1st set of Creative commons licenses released in December 2002^{2,5}

*An American [non-profit organization](#) and international network devoted to educational access and expanding the range of [creative works](#) available for others to build upon legally and to share.*⁵

Open Licensing

Why to use an open license?

Copyright laws

- Protects original work by default,
- Give several exclusive rights to the copyright holder,
- Can remain in effect until the death of author plus 70 years, etc.

Open Licensing

Why to use an open license?

OPEN LICENSES

A tool for creators to allow more freedom in what others can do with their work

Benefits of freedom

- Redistributing the work freely,
- Not forcing users to apply for permission every time they wish to use/circulate the work
- Improving the work,
- Creating new works derived from the original work, etc.

Open Licensing

How to apply an open license?

- What type of the content - text, images, data...?
- Rights and permissions to openly license the work.
- Other factors – requirements of the funder, institution, national legislation
- Which open license best suits your purposes?

Open Licensing

How to apply an open license?

- **Display a notice** somewhere prominent on your work **stating that your work is made available under the specific open license.**
- **Include a copy of, or a link to, the full text of your chosen license** in your work.

Open Licensing

Common license conditions⁷

Permission	Re-users must ask the copyright holder's permission before using the work.
Notification	Re-users must notify the copyright holder when they use the work.
Fulltext (FT)	Re-users must display the full text of the license every time they use the work.
Attribution (BY)	Re-users must attribute the work to the copyright holder when they use it.
ShareAlike (SA)	Re-users who create <u>derivatives of the work</u> must release the derivatives under the same license as the original work, if they choose to distribute the derivatives.
Noncommercial (NC)	The work can only be used for non-commercial purposes.
NonDerivatives (ND)	Re-users are not allowed to distribute <u>derivatives of the work</u> . (Essentially: the work cannot be modified.)

Public (Open) licences in Slovakia

Copyright Act – ACT 185/2015⁸

Public Licence (§ 76)

- Licence may be granted to **unidentified persons**
- Licence may only be granted as **non-exclusive**
free-of-charge
cannot be revoked

Autorský zákon – Zákon č.185/2015

Verejná licencia (§ 76)

- udelenie súhlasu na použitie diela bližšie neurčenému okruhu osôb
- vznik zmluvného vzťahu
- nevýhradná
- bezodplatná
- nemožno ju vypovedať


