- First Party Audit
- Second Party Audit
- Third Independent Party Audit



THE CERTIFICATION LANDSCAPE

(Who is Who?)

- Scheme owners private or public
- Accreditation Bodies (Abs) officially recognized by their national Governments to accredit Conformity Assessment Bodies (CABs).
- Certification Bodies, CABs accredited by ABs and scheme owners
- Laboratories or Auditors (based on Confidentiality, independence and impartiality, few support activity allowed) (ex.: ISO 17025)
- Implementation entities (Consulting firms)



THE CERTIFICATION LANDSCAPE

(Who is W<mark>ho?)</mark>

- Accreditation Bodies
- Certification Bodies, Notification Bodies (ISO 17065 based on Impartiality, consulting is not allowed)
- Laboratories, conformity assessment bodies (CABs), Auditors (based on Confidentiality, independence and impartiality, few support activity allowed) (ISO 17025)
- Implementation entities (Consulting firms)

CERTIFICACIÓN DE CONFORMIDAD CON EL Esquema Nacional de Seguridad

Example : IT Security Evaluation

- Scope: Common Criteria, Lince, BSZ, CSPN.
- National Agency is the Scheme Owner
- National Certification Body is part of the SO
- Accreditation Body and CB accredit testing labs
- Labs perform conformity assessment of products
- CB issues the Certificate

Example : Information Systems Security Audit

- Scope: National Security Scheme (ENS)
- National Agency is the Scheme Owner
- Private Certification Bodies are accredited by Accreditation Body and NA/SO
- CBs perform audits and issue certificates
