# Digital Humanities

- Interface between the humanities and computer sciences
- → systematic use of computer-aided methods & digital resources in the humanities & cultural studies + reflection on their application¹
- Community: librarians, historians, linguists, sociologists, musicians, ... computer scientists, digital humanists
- → research areas: digital editions, quantitative text analysis, visualization of complex data structures, theory of digital media¹
- DHd = Digital Humanities in German speaking countries

- FAIR sustainable data; BUT ecologically sustainable?

- Useful tool: DHCC-toolkit

# Own ecological impact

- Compress file sizes
- Prioritize & select the data to be stored
- Use tools to calculate energy consumption to identify & address problems
- "minimal computing"
- Extend the life of hardware
- Which electricity provider?
- How are the servers cooled?
- Zoom emission
- What are the policies at own institution?
