GraspOS at a glance

Develop, pilot and put into operation an **open and trusted federated infrastructure** to support and enable reforms towards “Open-Science-aware” Responsible Research Assessment (OS-aware RRA).

Offering **data, tools, services, and guidance** to support the reforms

Based on an **Open Science Assessment Framework (OSAF)** that assists translation OS & RRA principles into practice

At three levels

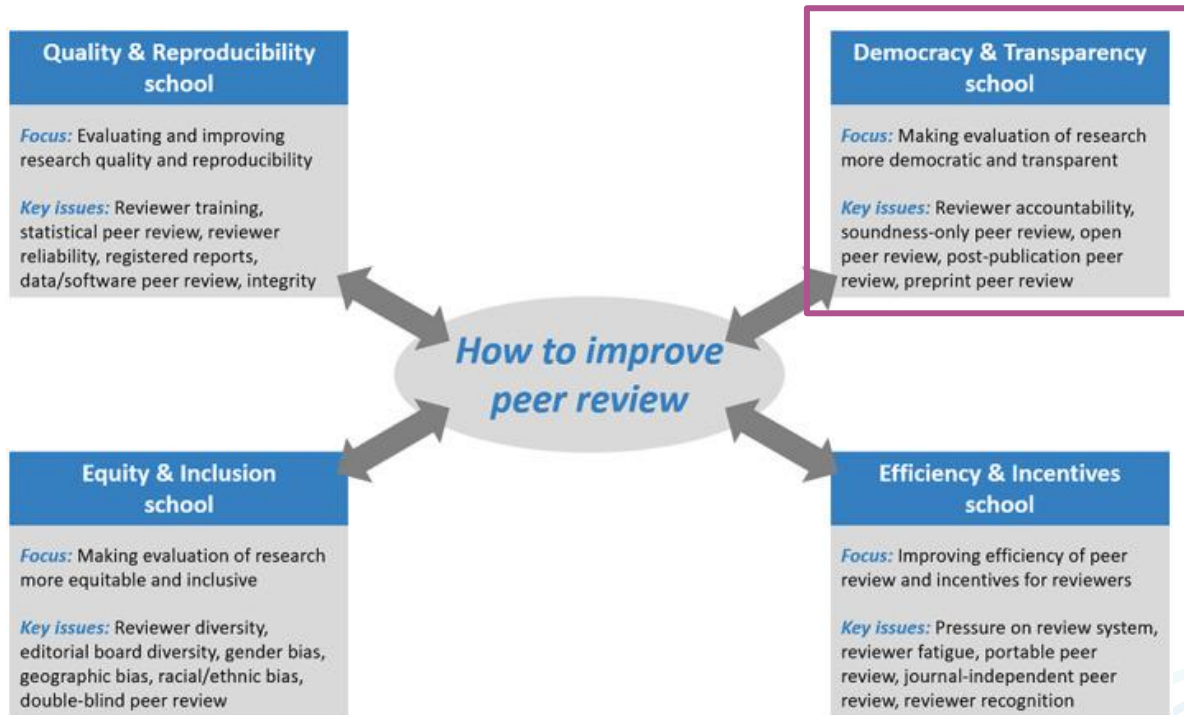
- individual/group researchers

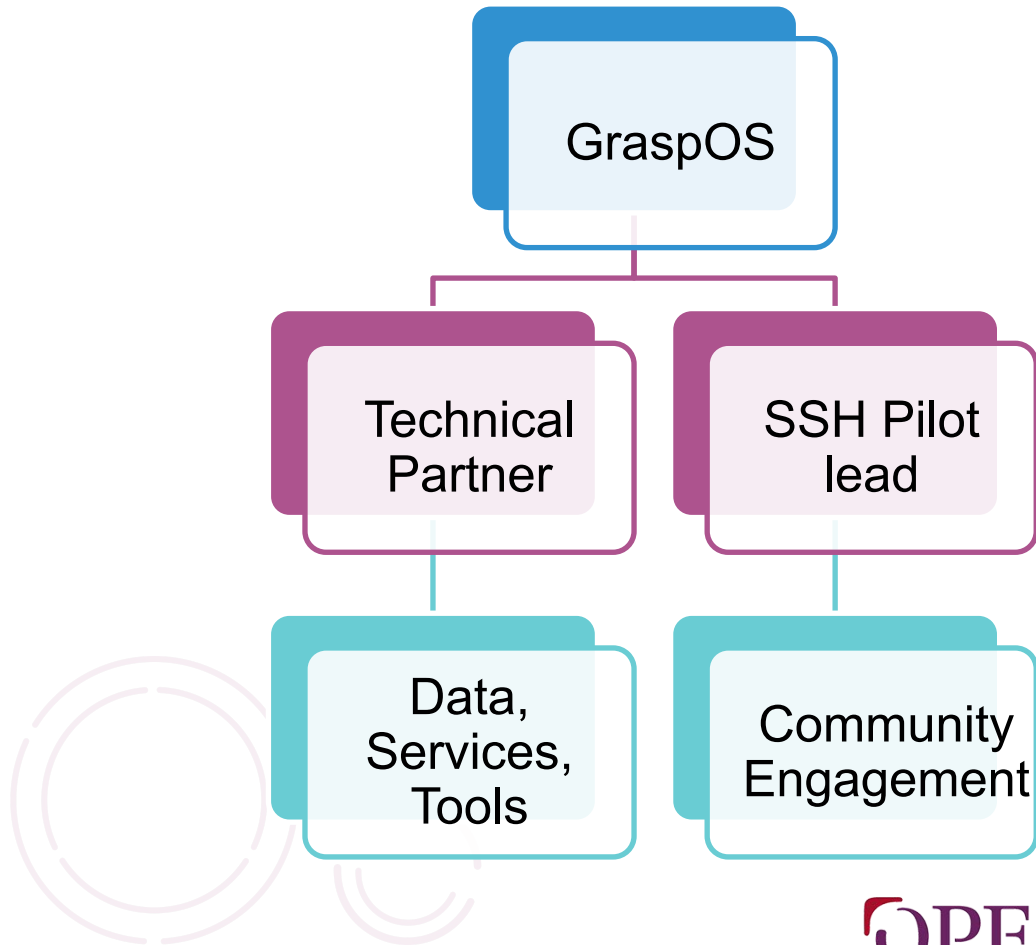

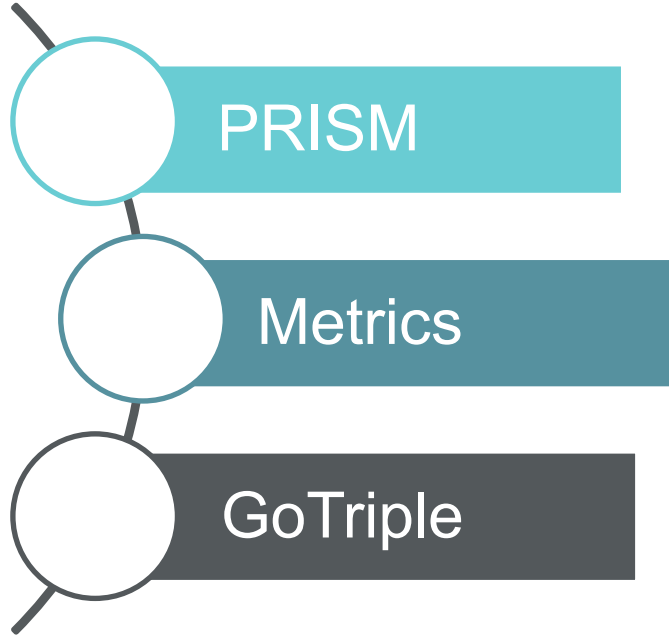

Metrics

- Collects usage and impact metrics related to published Open Access books from many different sources and displays them from a single access point.
- Provides a transparent mechanism to collect, aggregate and present usage metrics.

In GraspOS:

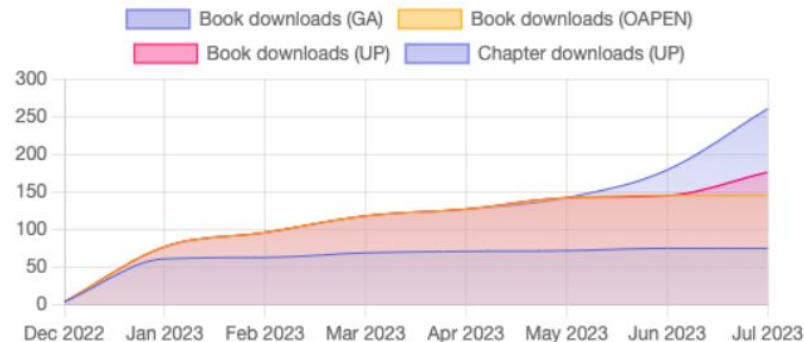
An important tool to value Open Access Books and contribute to their assessment.

OPERAS Definitions: Book downloads (GA), Book downloads (OAPEN), Chapter downloads (UP)



- A platform to discover and reuse open scholarly SSH resources (publications, datasets, projects) in multiple languages.
- 15M+ documents, 1.3K+ data sources, 400 user profiles, UI in 8 languages, keywords in 11 languages

In GraspOS:

An important data source to value and monitor diverse SSH outputs in different languages.
