




1. RESPONSIBLE RESEARCH ASSESSMENT

• **Starting with DORA 2012**, several initiatives have shaped conversations about responsible research assessment (RRA) across the international research community










RRA AGENDA

• "[R]esponsible research assessment (RRA) ... is an umbrella term for approaches to assessment which incentivise, reflect and reward the plural characteristics of high-quality research, in support of diverse and inclusive research cultures.

- The objectives of Responsible Research Assessment (RRA) are:
 - Balancing qualitative and quantitative methods
 - Recognition of the diversity of academic work
 - Appreciation of disciplinary differences
 - Incentivizing open science practices

THE REFORM AGREEMENT

- Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment, published on 20 July 2022, establishes a common direction for research assessment reform. It is based on
 - 10 overarching principles,
 - 10 commitments: 4 core and 6 supporting
 - timeframe for reforms: 1 and 5 years after signing
- Signature of the Agreement is open to all organisations involved in research assessment.
- Agreement does not have any legally binding effect but it represents a public commitment to contribute actively and constructively to reforming research assessment.

CORE COMMITMENTS




- 1. Recognise the diversity of contributions to, and careers in, research in accordance with the needs and nature of the research
- 2. Base research assessment primarily on qualitative evaluation for which peer review is central, supported by responsible use of quantitative indicators
- Abandon inappropriate uses in research assessment of journal- and publicationbased metrics, in particular inappropriate uses of Journal Impact Factor (JIF) and h-index
- 4. Avoid the use of rankings of research organisations in research assessment

2. COARA – COALITION FOR ADVANCING RESEARCH ASSESSMENT

THE COALITION

- **Signatory organisations** can apply to become **members of CoARA** (Coalition for Advancing Research Assessment) and join a community to facilitate the implementation of their own reform and enable systemic change.
- The Coalition offers a space for its members to learn from others' experiences, to advance the process of research assessment reform in Europe and beyond.
- The Coalition is governed by its General Assembly of Members and Steering Board and supported by a Secretariat hosted by the European Science Foundation (ESF)-Science Connect.
- Coalition members are invited to be involved in National Chapters and Working Groups and other Coalition activities.






COARA MEMBERSHIP BY TYPE OF ORGANISATION





NATIONAL CHAPTERS


- National Chapters (NCs) are dedicated to assisting CoARA members in implementing the commitments of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment in a national/regional context.
- NCs are proposed at the initiative of CoARA members, and participation from members is voluntary.
- Any CoARA member from the given country can participate in the call for their respective NC.
- NCs contribute to CoARA's work by facilitating the exchange of knowledge, mutual learning, and discussions on CoARA-relevant issues specific to different types of organisations in a given country.





NATIONAL CHAPTER FINLAND


- Federation of Finnish Learned Societies (TSV) proposed o behalf of 29 organisations

MISSION AND OBJECTIVES


- The mission is to support the entire Finnish research community in its journey towards a quality
 focused assessment culture that recognises the full diversity and impact of academic work
- The objectives are to:
 - 1. Raise awareness and discussion about the importance of assessment reform
 - 2. Engage all types of stakeholders in the movement for change, including organisations that already are or could become CoARA signatories.
 - 3. Discover the most responsible assessment approaches and alleviate contradictions between different assessment layers and processes
 - 4. Facilitate the effective and timely implementation of CoARA commitments and other supporting and related recommendations

- Strengthens the collaboration and interoperability of existing working groups and networks
 - Steering-group for Responsible Researcher Assessment + Working Group
 - AVOTT Responsible assessment and incentives
 - Finn-ARMA Research Evaluation
 - Finn-ARMA Publication metrics
- The Recommendation for the responsible evaluation of a researcher was published in 2020
 - Finnish Career-Assessment Matrix (FIN-CAM)
 - National training on responsible assessment


