### Introduction

The following appendix describes the 200 manuscripts Jacques Rosenthal offered for sale in his two-volume catalogue *BMAM* published in 1925 and 1928. It presents data extracted from *BMAM* and archives I analysed in my publications investigating Rosenthal's working methods and the criteria he used to assign a financial value to the manuscripts.<sup>1</sup> Its aim is therefore not to provide detailed descriptions of the manuscripts but to gather information provided by *BMAM*, even though it has been since revised and could be completed by additional research, and archival sources.

The manuscripts are arranged by their number in the *BMAM* and each entry contains four sections. The first section (in bold) indicates the author of the work, its title in an abbreviated form, date and place of production, support, and number of folios.<sup>2</sup> The items consulted in their holding institutions and in digital form are indicated by the symbol \* at the end of the first section. The second section first determines the subject of the work according to the nine following categories: Bible, composite (for volumes containing works with multiple subjects), history, law, literature, liturgy, philosophy, science, and theology. Then, it specifies if the work contains a standard or non-standard version of the text. Non-standard versions gather either unprinted texts or texts differing from versions recorded in reference catalogues, such as Ludwig Hain's *Repertorium bibliographicum* (Stuttgart/Paris: Cotta/Renouard, 1826–1836) and Jacques-Paul Migne's *Patrologia cursus completes, Series latina* (Paris: Migne, 1844–1865). It also describes the language of the work, colophons, the decoration, the binding, the completeness and condition of the work, as well as the manuscript's provenance.<sup>3</sup>

There are six types of decoration:

- 1. Rubrication or no decoration
- 2. Small painted initials
- 3. Decorated initials
- 4. Historiated initials
- 5. Drawings, large, and small miniatures
- 6. Full-page, large, and small miniatures

There are also six types of bindings categorised according to their material, decoration, and the techniques used:

- 1. Pasteboards covered in paper
- 2. Half parchment and parchment over pasteboards or wooden boards
- 3. Half tanned skin and tanned skin over pasteboards or wooden boards
- 4. Tanned or white skin over pasteboards or wooden boards, tooled in blind, with clasps and furniture
- 5. Tanned skin over wooden boards richly tooled in blind or gold, with clasps and furniture; morocco over pasteboards tooled in blind or gold; velvet over pasteboards or wooden boards
- 6. Silver over wooden boards, decorated with silver filigree, rock crystal bosses, and four carved ivory plaques.

The third section provides information about Rosenthal's source of acquisition and the price he paid for the item with references in brackets to archives and sale and auction catalogues documenting the transaction.<sup>4</sup> Auctions of named collections are recorded under the collection's owner, not the auctioneer (for example Sir Thomas Phillipps, not Sotheby's). To keep the entries short, I only give the earliest known date of entry of an item in Rosenthal's stock, even if additional sources and material evidence attest to its presence in later years. Then, I specify if Rosenthal offered the manuscript in one of his previous catalogues, including that of the auction he organised with Sotheby's in April 1899, and finally I provide the book's sale price in *BMAM*, which Rosenthal printed on separate leaves.<sup>5</sup>

In the fourth part, I indicate the name of the manuscript's buyer and the date of purchase (as noted in Rosenthal's annotated copies of *BMAM*; references to complementary sources are given in brackets).<sup>6</sup> I trace the unsold items in the catalogues of Rosenthal's heirs when their trajectories are identifiable. Finally, I describe the manuscript's current location and the identification number of its record in the SDBM.<sup>7</sup>

At the end are indexes of the data analysed in the entries; they contain information about provenance and Rosenthal's sources of acquisition, immediate owners, and the manuscripts' shelfmarks. These are followed by lists of archival material and library, auction, and sale catalogues cited in the records.
