OPENORGS: ORGANISATION DISAMBIGUATION

- Goal -> Make information more accessible and help people find and recognize organisations easily.
- **Challenging**
- Multiple names and identifiers collected from different sources -> Hard to:
 - Share information
 - Find research
 - Monitor activities
 - Develop a proper linked open scholarly communication system
- Mix of automated processes (A) with human curation (H)
 - Create suggestions (A)
 - **Curate** (H)
 - Create representative organisations (A)

OPENORGS: How to become a curator

- Register for an OpenAIRE account: <https://services.openaire.eu/uoar-user-management/register.jsp>
- On the first login at <https://orgs.openaire.eu/> by using your OpenAIRE account, request to become a curator
- OpenOrgs team will process your request.
- You will be able to curate the information for your organisation:
 - Duplicates
 - Parent/Child relationships

What should I do if my RPO is not displayed on the National Open Access Monitor, Ireland?

- Your RPO has not been incorporated into OpenAIRE and OpenOrgs. The process is to:
 - Contact us: <https://oamonitor.ireland.openaire.eu/contact-us>
 - **Get a ROR id**, if you don't already have one. [ROR Request Form](#)
 - Inform us when you have the ROR id assigned to your RPO.
- We have notified all RPOs that have filled the survey and do not have a ROR id and informed them about the process.
