International collaboration as a common approach to improve the FAIRness of non-numeric/ qualitative research data

The approach of QualidataNet

- built up in the context of the National Research Data Infrastructure in Germany as part of the Consortium for the Social, Behavioral, Educational and Economic Sciences
- Idea:
 - The re-use of qualitative data is still an exception in Germany. One reason is the fragmentation of existing archiving services for qualitative data.
 - To overcome fragmentation and to improve the integration of heterogeneity into a common approach, we established QualidataNet – a network for qualitative data.





Qualidata-Net – a central point of entry for qualitative data

- QualidataNet bundles as a ,central point of entry' information about the management, use and sharing of qualitative research data.
- It connects providers of qualitative data and promotes exchange.
- QualidataNet is open to all RDCs, archives, repositories, that hold qualitative data and make them available for re-use.

Advantages for researchers

- QualidataNet offers centralized access to qualitative data,
- supports in finding the right archiving partner and
- guides through the specialized infrastructure offerings.
- QualidataNet offers an RDM-portfolio for qualitative data coordinated templates and handouts to facilitate dealing with the central aspects of data sharing and research data management of qualitative data.





Advantages for infrastructures

- QualidataNet increases the **visibility and findability of datasets** and facilitates the re-use of qualitative data.
- Jointly dealing with central aspects of research data management, archiving and data sharing of qualitative data avoids duplicate developments and takes the expertise of specialized archiving partners for a particular type of data into account.








1 The QualidataNet – search portal

Findability & Accessibility

- launched in Jan 2024 offers centralized access to qualitative data
- condition to take part: datasets need to be provided with a persistent identifier (e.g. DOI) and flagged for harvesting
- We are continuously further developing the search portal and integrating further datasets to increase the number of data available for data re-use.





2 QualiTerm: Controlled Vocabularies for the description of qualitative data


Interoperability & Reusability

- The CV contains methodological elements of qualitative data such as sampling procedures, methods of data collection and qualitative analysis.
- development in cooperation with researchers
- the DDI-WG on controlled vocabularies provided feedback on sampling methods. Further feedback is very welcome.
- Some RDCs started using QualiTerm in their metadatsets. The publication via CESSDA is planned.





4 Coordinated RDM-portfolio for qualitative data







QualidataNet - RDM-Portfolio

Reusability

- QualidataNet develops and offers a coordinated RDM-Portfolio for qualitative data, which includes the expertise of the network partners.
- It aims at putting researchers in the position to prepare FAIR research materials already during the research project.
- RDCs share the tools they are working with e.g., QualiAnon a tool for the anonymization of textual data and




 work on fact sheets informing about legal issues such as data protection and copyright law

Interoperability & Reusability

- Comming from the starting point that cross-domain data sharing is becoming increasingly common
- the Working Group aims at describing the qualitative data objects in a way that also other disciplines can identify them as potential source for their research interests and vice versa.
- We are currently searching for use cases to test the model and working on the description of different qualitative datasets (e.g., making annotations of audiovisual material a part of a dataset description)





Some of the next steps

- integrate further datasets into the search portal
- provide a cooperated guidance-document on data sharing of qualitative data
- include further DDI-CDI use cases
- collect best practices of secondary re-use of qualitative data in cooperation with researchers
- widen the network and learn more about the different developed data sharing and archiving solutions
