### Why Standards Are Important?



- Standards help technologies work together
- Standards enable interoperability
- Standards facilitate market access
- Standards can play a role in human rights

#### **ITU: A Time-Tested & Trusted Platform**



- ITU has a historical legacy
- ITU is a global collaboration platform
- ITU study groups are expert-driven
- Study groups have consensus-based processes



#### **Human Rights Considerations**

- Governments have obligations to protect human rights set out under international human rights law, including in the digital context (UN General Assembly, Resolution A/RES/68/167, 2013)
- The Human Rights Council in 2021 with the Resolution 47/23 called for closer cooperation between the UN Human Rights Office (OHCHR) and Standards Development Organizations including the ITU to consider the relationship between technical standards and human rights.
