
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UNVEILING SOCIETAL REALITIES: A CRITICAL ANALYSIS OF GLOC-9'S 'UPUAN ' SONG ADDRESSING SOCIAL ISSUES

Abstract

This research embarks on a thorough examination of realism theory as portrayed in Gloc9's song "Upuan." Employing a qualitative and quantitative design with a descriptive method, the study engaged ten (10) respondents to delve into the song's intricate layers. Utilizing interviews and focus group discussions as primary analytical tools, the research uncovered a robust political narrative embedded within "Upuan," delineated by three prominent subthemes: Greed for Power, Poverty, and Corruption. Through its lyrics, the song elucidates the imperative of keen observation of those in positions of authority to discern the true state of society, while concurrently advocating for leaders to uphold their responsibility to the populace. Furthermore, the analysis underscores the profound impact of music, particularly exemplified by "Upuan," in shedding light on pressing social issues, thus serving as a potent vehicle for social commentary and awareness.

As a recommendation stemming from the study's findings, the researchers advocate for the incorporation of Realism Theory into educational curricula, positing it as a pivotal means to augment students' comprehension of societal dynamics. Moreover, the research underscores the transformative potential of music, urging society to recognize its capacity to foster social consciousness and catalyze positive change. In essence, the study serves as both a scholarly exploration and a poignant reminder of music's enduring role in shaping societal discourse and fostering collective awareness.

INTRODUCTION

Songs are one of the methods to express thoughts or feelings, opinions or grievances to a person based on things and events. Using songs, a person can express his feelings without difficulty in expressing his own words. Songs also help in solving problems as negative thinking becomes positive. Huerter (2020) explained, that music is said to be the highest type of art and culture that is often made or composed because it is influenced by time. According to De Guzman (2021), music contributes to the unity of a society and can increase the effective organization of a group. Music with messages about war, lullabies, and national anthems help unite different families, majority groups, and the entire world. Misunderstandings and problems in society and especially disharmony with each other. The idea of music is related to society and has a great help in the unity of the people and provides a lot of evidence.

Singers have different styles in their singing such as Aristotle Pollisco, better known as Gloc-9, who made love songs and raps, who is known for making songs about personal compassion in the daily hardships, in the face of the conflict crisis in the Philippines. One of the most popular rappers in the Philippines today is Gloc-9. He was once considered by the late master rapper Francis Magalona (1964-2009) to be a "smith of words and letters, and a true Filipino poet". In addition, in 2011 and 2012 he won the following awards and honors: Best Movie Theme Song for "Hari Ng Tondo" from the Famas Awards, Indie Rockers of the Year from the Globe Tattoo Awards. The song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 reflects the social issues facing our country. It wishes that the citizens of our country have a voice and a voice to convey every message to their neighbors and the society they live in. The researchers wish that through this analysis to make people aware of the problems that are occurring and facing our country. The researcher saw the importance of studying the ability of rap music in the Philippines not only in the creative presentation of the story but even in the discussion of social matters.

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In Tamse's (2017) research, the researchers proved that Filipino songs can be found in real-life events and also in the desire to reveal to everyone who will hear some things about the events in human life. This song selection truly reflects life. It can be seen that through music, some composers present and express about the real events of human life and even social issues that leave a message to the listeners and the people who are in a position to make them aware. , take action and solve the long-standing problem. According to the study of Giancarlo (2018), many Filipino songs have been heard and almost all of them can be seen in the events of a person's life, but there are few songs that contain problems or issues in society. It is heard every day on the radio and seen on television through the news. That's how the song "Ilusyon" by Abra can be seen. There are many issues in society from the past to the present time that cannot be answered and solved due to several reasons.

The song "Upuan" indicates the various realist issues facing the country that deserve attention. As a future teacher, it is important to have a deep understanding of Realism Theory. Theory Realism deals with reality in society. Tiongson (2020) asserted, the continued importance and weight of social awareness as the foundation of the creation of art and literature is that a person enriches his knowledge and deepens his self-awareness.

METHODOLOGY

This study is a qualitative analysis of the ideas, opinions, and knowledge contained in Gloc-9's songs, specifically his song "Upuan." The Descriptive or Description design was used by the researchers to present the contents and message of the aforementioned song. For this purpose, the direct method was used to obtain the data, where Gloc-9's song was obtained directly and from the internet. The main purpose of the review is to present and identify the social issues that exist in the "Seat." Realism theory and content analysis were used to understand the messages and content featured in the song.

As part of the research step, the researchers started by listening to different songs by Gloc-9, choosing a music that has to do with a social issue. A thorough analysis of the song "Chair" was conducted by identifying and analyzing lines that contained social issues, as well as the overall message of the song. The researchers also took the step of obtaining permission from Gloc-9 for the analysis of his song and had a questionnaire using "Google Form" answered by the respondents. Researchers gather data and analyze it in one place, and then consult with their advisor to ensure the accuracy and order of their analysis.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The researchers read and understood carefully the contained messages, feelings or thoughts and events in human life and the society they belong to in the song "Upuan" created by Gloc-9. The researchers gathered data from a selection of ten (10) respondents who were familiar with the song "Upuan". The selected respondents and researchers analyzed the contents and message of the said song. Descriptive analysis used the data recorded. This chapter contains the results of the study that answers the problems presented in Chapter I. The results gathered here are studied and based on real life.

Problem 1: What are the lines in the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 that can be related to real events in society?

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Based on the results of the researchers' analysis, seventy percent (70%) of the respondents stated that the main theme of the song "Upuan" is related to politics. Politics, according to their analysis, describes activities, actions, and beliefs related to governance, power, and decision-making processes in a society or group. This includes matters such as the distribution of power, policy development, and the organization of society. Politics focuses on issues of authority, public policy, and control within a community, region, or nation.

In providing context to the results of the analysis, the researchers refer to the statement of Hannah Arendt (2019), a well-known philosopher and author of works such as "The Human Condition" and "The Origins of Totalitarianism." According to Arendt, she discussed totalitarianism, the nature of power, and the role of individuals in society. His analysis focuses on the relationship between individuals, institutions, and the natural nature of power dynamics in a society. Arendt emphasized the importance of an active focus on political discourse, resistance to the use of violence and coercion, and participation in activity that cultivates meaningful democratic dialogue. His ideas shed light on the researchers' analysis of the political theme in Gloc-9's song "Upuan", especially in the context of power, social control, and citizen participation.

1.1 What is the theme in the stanza of the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9?

... In the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9, a deep and figurative message is laid out by greed for power. The lyrics of the song tell the story of a man who only wants power and possessions. It shows a deceitful will, where the person has become greedy and careless about other people's welfare. The message of the song is very important because it deals with the issue of violence and disharmony in society. The song shows that the pursuit of power and the pursuit of self-interest will not benefit everyone. This is a reminder that we should care about our neighbors and value the true goodness and prosperity of all. In the end, greed for power only leads to the absence of true happiness and the absence of peace. The song "Upuan" is a criticism of the behavior of some people who are ready to sacrifice everything just to realize their ambition for power. This is a reminder to all of us to insist on appreciating the simple things that can truly bring us joy. Thinking that power is the key to true success and happiness is a big mistake. Ultimately, the message of the song suggests that it is a great loss in life to be greedy for power, and one must know this in order to achieve true happiness and peace.

In filipino language, "sa kantang "Upuan" ni Gloc-9, isang malalim at matalinhagang mensahe ang inilalatag ng sakim sa kapangyarihan. ... This indicates that there is no room for change because of people who are greedy for power. They are blind to the reality of the people and appear to be the puppets of the corrupt politicians who are more powerful, becoming submissive just to stay in their position.

In filipino language, "ipinapahiwatig nito na walang puwang ang pagbabago dahil sa mga taong sakim sa kapangyarihan. Sila ay nag bubulag bulagan sa realidad ng mamamayan at nagmimistulang mga tuta ng mga korap na Politikong mas makapangyarihan, nagiging sunod sunuran upang manatili lamang sa kanilang posisyon."

One of the respondents also says

... The song also shows the condition of people in high positions and how they have become greedy for power and do not know how to look at people in need.

In filipino language, "Ipinapakita din sa kanta ang kalagayan ng mga taong nasa itaas na posisyon at kung paano sila naging sakim sa kapangyarihan at hindi marunong tumingin sa mga taong nangangailangan."

The greed for power of people in government positions is also supported by another participant who says ... The message on greed for power shows how the politician becomes greedy for power

Also other participants also shared common ideas like other participants

... The message or lesson of Gloc 9's song Upuan about Greed for Power, the Philippines needs a good leader who has action and knows how to meet the needs of the poor in life.

And additional participants who say a message for the leaders

... Don't abuse the position but be an effective leader.

One of the respondents also had a message that he wanted to convey to the leaders

... They should be aware of serving the people with dignity.

Another respondent said the same

... It challenges the leaders of our country to serve the people with care and integrity in all their activities.

One of the participants often repeats and resembles a meaningful statement

... The abuse of power for self-interest is already shown.

Based on what Demeterio (2015) said, politics is one of the dirtiest games in society. Many people die because of it. They are killing each other for a position. A position that empowers them and will do whatever it wants. One of the problems of politics in the Philippines is corruption. People still experience corruption and problems even today.

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One of the most affected by this problem is the poor sector of our society. In short, a person's obsession with a position or having power affected the poor people even more and the rich people got even richer.

According to the study of Beltran, et.al (2018), it is stated that with the purpose of showing the condition and social problem that the author belongs to, the song "Upuan" enters this theory because it indicates different conditions or states of life of the two groups by describing their habitats, food, and daily lifestyle.

In this stanza there are ninety percent (90%) from the selected ten (10) respondents that this lyric from the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 is about poverty. Another participant in the response also shared a personal idea regarding the lyrics of the song.

... In my opinion, the message of the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 is to discuss the challenges and hardships that poor Filipinos suffer in their daily lives. The song shows the hardship and fatigue caused by not having enough income and opportunities. It is a reminder of the trials faced by the less fortunate in life, especially those who work decently but still earn not enough to provide for their families. In the lyrics of this song, Gloc-9's desire to give a voice to people at the bottom of society can be seen. He shows that seeking service and persevering in getting a job is the only way to rise up the state in life. However, the song also expresses the fatigue and discouragement brought by the little prosperity enjoyed by the poor. This is the message that motivated the listeners to join the people that Gloc-9 describes in his song. "Chair" is a poem of hope, struggle, and determination. It is a reminder that despite daily challenges and difficulties, one should never give up. The song evokes our heroism, as citizens of the country, to help those in need and offer help to others. Through the existence of compassion and strategy, change and progress can be experienced as a society. The song "Upuan" is more than a song, it is a challenge and a reminder that we should not abandon our fellow Filipinos in the midst of life's trials.

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In filipino language, "Sa aking palagay, ang mensahe ng kantang "Upuan" ni Gloc-9 ay ang pagtalakay sa mga hamon at kahirapan na dinaranas ng mga mahihirap na Pilipino sa pang-arawaraw na buhay. Ipinapakita ng kanta ang paghihirap at pagkapagod na dulot ng kawalan ng sapat na kita at oportunidad. Ito ay isang pag-alala sa mga pagsubok na hinaharap ng mga hindi gaanong swerte sa buhay, lalo na ang mga nagtatrabaho ng marangal ngunit kulang pa rin ang kinikita upang guminhawa ang kanilang pamilya. The quote below is from one of the participants who the researchers considered very smart and intelligent in giving us feedback and said

... It can be seen in the song that the possible situation of poor people is singled out but maybe it is not right if we blame the government because we have our own lives and the solution is in our hands to escape from the complicated life. We need to work hard so that we can taste the comfort.

This is also supported by a reply,

... For me the lesson of poverty is that it should be time to look at the condition of poor citizens and help people in government positions.

Poverty is not only caused by corrupt leaders but also requires an active citizenry, responded one of our respondents

... This shows the importance of perseverance and suffering to reach the dream and have a bright future.

Based on the study of Beltran, et.al (2018), the song "Upuan" also states the theory of Realism with the purpose of showing the experiences and witnessed by the author in his society and that is the corruption and poverty that happens in real life but as the rich politicians get more and more prosperous, the condition of the poor society gets worse. Most of them could not eat three times a day and they considered themselves lucky if they could eat rice every day. They vote for those politicians who believe there is hope that the people in office will do what they promise - to improve their lives. Every election there is a new agenda, a promise that will not be kept because once they get the position, those promises are forgotten. Gloc-9 wrote this song as a call to those in power. The power to make other people's lives better. The people behind those high walls, living in a mansion, riding in a convoy. People who

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have a position, a position given by people who have given their trust. Being trustworthy is a privilege but they don't see the essence of being a leader- to lead the country and improve the lives of its citizens.

Based on the study of Pineda, et. al (2017), it has the idea of describing the song that refers to the rich or the poor. From the images or details, it can be concluded that what is described "The wall of our house is patched with iron" can be seen that this is the condition of the poor Filipinos in our society due to the worsening corruption in the Philippines. Above are the lines in the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 which shows the social issue of poverty where the characters or persona in the song took risks and worked so that despite the hardships they are suffering, they can help even if it is difficult and necessary sacrifice. According to Pedro (2020), the style of Aristotle "Gloc-9" Pollisco in the development of his selected songs: "Upuan", "Magda", and "Sirena". In particular, it investigates the figurative language used, the common characteristics of songs, and the social issues depicted in rap songs. Which means that Gloc-9 used figurative words in a formal way so that every lyric that is said in said song will be more stimulating in the mind of its listeners and will penetrate into their hearts.

In this verse, sixty percent (60%) say that this part of the song refers to greed and corruption. The quote below is from one of the participants who the researchers considered very smart and intelligent in giving us feedback and said:

... The song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 is a meaningful tune that highlights the message about corruption in society. Lyrically, the song shows the daily experiences of people dealing with poverty and abusive officials embezzling public funds. This is a deep and passionate discussion on the issue of corruption that continues to affect our country. In this song, the effect of corruption on people's desire to rise from poverty is also shown. In the midst of adversity, the chair will be a symbol of hope and success. But instead of being a bridge to cancerous corruption, it becomes a symbol of abuse and neglect by those who lead our society. The song also shows that corruption causes misery and hopelessness to live a dignified life. Through the song "Upuan," we are reminded that corruption is an obstacle to progress and equality in our society. It shows the injustice and bias towards the poor, while the corrupt officials continue to neglect and fill their pockets. This song is a call for change and having the right leadership that is responsible and cares for the people. This is a reminder that we, as citizens, must come together and fight corruption in order to change our society and preserve the future of future generations.

And additional participants who say a message for the leaders

... This will indicate the life enjoyed by corrupt politicians in our country. Pocketing the people's money for personal luxury.

Also other participants also shared common ideas like other participants

... In the world we live in, corruption cannot really be avoided when it comes to politics. It can be seen in the song that there are people who are ungrateful and think more about themselves than helping others.

This was also supported by a reply

... Corruption that never ends no matter who sits in a high position corruption has remained and is still rampant until now and in the future. There is no solution to corruption as long as people are greedy and blinded by money.

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One of the participants often repeats and resembles a meaningful statement

...This shows confidence in the leader of our country and their duty to serve the people with goodness and honesty.

Another participant confirms his life observation regarding the lyrics of the song

... The message or lesson of Gloc 9's song Upuan about Corruption is that the Philippines needs a good government to meet the needs of the Filipino people.

Corruption is shown in this lyric is also supported by another participant who says

... The lesson we can learn from corruption in this song is that we must stop blinding and deafening people because the rich will get richer and the poor will get poorer.

Also other participants also shared common ideas like other participants

... Corruption that the people's money should only be for the people.

Another participant in the response also shared his personal idea regarding the lyrics of the song

... Leaders are aware to help the citizens.

One of the respondents also says

... The lesson to be learned from the chair song is. Pay attention to what is happening in society.

It clearly sees the higher authorities as greedy and selfish with the power that their position holds. No doubt they despise the idea of being powerless. Those people usually have no sympathy for individuals who are helpless in their eyes which is why they will continue to hold that power by doing anything, be it legal or illegal. According to the analysis of Feliciano (2019), the song "Upuan" indicates that those who are rich or who are in government are also the ones who benefit. It can be said that the writer destroys this ideology because he wants to show through the song that the people who sit on the chair are equal to the people who have no position, in other words he wants to remove the symbolism of the "Chair" so that no one can stand up and down.

The second stanza of the rap, on the other hand, describes the dire reality of the workers and the lower classes. The lines depict hunger, poverty due to corruption, social conflict, lack of opportunities, and prejudice, all of which are strongly embedded in the modern principalia or "seated man" administration and the actions and policies they impose. It's no wonder how the lower classes express their frustration as those people sit in the "chair" who continue to turn a blind eye and continue to ignore the plight of their subjects, who are the same people who put them in that position in the first place. place

Based on Perez (2021), it is important to realize that having power is a double-edged sword. Power is defined as an individual's ability to influence the behaviors, beliefs, or behaviors of others in social science and politics. Modern principalia have the capacity to influence and change the system. If power is used wisely, it can be used for positive changes such as the growth and development of society but if it is abused, unethical tactics will be taken which will result in cruel and undesirable harms. that society needs to face and that is when the unfortunate truth hits which is the main point of the song "Upuan."

Problem 3: What is the message or lesson of the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 to the listeners?

Message about the greedy for power

Based on the responses of the respondents to the message of the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 about those who are greedy for power, there are four (4) out of ten (10) respondents who say that it will make those in government positions aware to serve they in the town with dignity. The Filipino people need an effective leader who has action and knows how to address the issues facing the society and a good leader pays attention to the people around him and cares about the people. Some responders say that it is a great loss in life to be greedy for power and one must know this in order to achieve peace. It is also said that politicians are greedy for power and abuse power for their own

A particularly important quality is vision, along with the power to implement that vision. The political process is done to promote the public good and hold political authorities accountable.

Based on what Joel Westheimer, Joseph Kahne (2016) said, Policy makers or government officials are increasingly working on programs that aim to strengthen democracy through service learning, etc. Based on Democratic theory and findings from their study, the authors elaborate three conceptions of the "good" citizen—personally responsible, participatory, and justice-oriented—emphasizing the political implications of education for democracy. The country will not develop without a proper and effective leader. Everyone sitting in office needs to take action to help every Filipino who is suffering and needs help.

Message about poverty

Based on the responses of the respondents to the message of the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 about poverty, according to the responses of the respondents seven (7) out of ten (10) who participated said that poverty has been the problem of society since then until right now it is said to be due to the lack of jobs, lack of wages and opportunities for Filipino workers and the lack of proper health of the common people which becomes the root of poverty. But it seems that the message contained in the song will not happen because this person would rather stay seated and enjoy the benefits of his day instead of helping and giving priority to the people who are truly suffering for the country. Generalization

Five (5) out of ten (10) respondents say that the song "Upuan" by Gloc-9 solves the problem or issue by making the person sitting in the position realize that they have made a solution or addressed the people's grievances don't turn a blind eye and turn a deaf ear to the situation of society. It is also stated here that it gives a message to people in positions so that they can hear the grievances of the people under their control, provides knowledge and information that what is indicated in the song is about people sitting in high positions who are expected to help the people but corruption is rampant.
