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
Need for reform of research assessment

- To reflect evolving research processes
 - ✓ Digital transition; Iterative and recursive; Collaborative and open
- To reflect increasing demands on research
 - ✓ Societal, environmental, economic challenges; Diversity of outputs
- To move away from inappropriate uses of journal- and publication-based metrics
 - ✓ Rewards quantity and publication venue rather than quality; does not reward sharing, collaboration and outputs other than publications
- To further support the quality of research and the attractiveness of research environments
 - ✓ Requires a system and cultural change, involving institutions, funders and researchers



Current rewards system


Which types of academic work matter most for research careers?

Commitment 1 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Recognise the diversity of contributions to, and careers in, research in accordance with the needs and the nature of the research

The Commission already:

- Integrated the recognition of a more diverse set of research contributions and careers as part of the award criteria & in the application and reporting forms of Horizon Europe
- Made mandatory the adoption of a Gender Equality Plan in Horizon Europe
- Set up the <u>Open Research Europe</u> publishing platform for EU funding beneficiaries

- Identify improvements to the information requested from applicants and to the reporting forms and Key Impact Pathways (R&I Framework Programme)
- Continue developing Open Research
 Europe into an open-source
 infrastructure and service supported by
 additional funders



Commitment 2 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Base research assessment primarily on qualitative evaluation for which peer-review is central, supported by responsible use of quantitative indicators

The Commission already:

- Put in place a robust peer-review of research proposals, based on welldefined criteria (Horizon Europe)
- Has processes in place to ensure a balanced composition of peerreviewers (experience, knowledge and disciplines, geographical diversity, gender)

- Identify improvements to the selection of peer-reviewers (R&I Framework Programme)
- Consider piloting innovative assessment processes of research proposals



Commitment 3 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Abandon inappropriate uses in research assessment of journal- and publication-based metrics, in particular inappropriate uses of Journal Impact Factor (JIF) and h-index

The Commission already:

- Endorsed the San Francisco
 Declaration on Research Assessment (DORA)
- Moved away from asking and taking into account JIF in the assessment of past achievements, and instructed reviewers accordingly (Horizon Europe)
- Set up <u>Open Research Europe</u>, where each article has a dedicated page of article-level metrics

The Commission will:

 Identify improvements to the Key Impact Pathways to ensure indicators are used responsibly and are not based on JIF and h-index (R&I Framework Programme)



Commitment 4 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Avoid the use of rankings of research organisations in research assessment

The Commission does not make use of rankings of research organisations in the assessment of research proposals under the R&I Framework Programme



Commitment 5 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Commit resources to reforming research assessment as is needed to achieve the organisational changes committed to

The Commission already:

- Contributed in-kind to facilitate the preparation of the Agreement and of the CoARA coalition
- Contributed in-kind to the extended CoARA secretariat during the first 9 months of operation of the coalition (December 2022 – September 2023)

The Commission will:

- Continue contributing in-kind to the functioning of CoARA (as observer to the Steering Board, and participant in Working Groups)
- Dedicate in-kind resources for the internal work needed to review and develop improved research assessment criteria, tools and processes in the R&I Framework Programme
- Support financially the operation of CoARA (CoARA Boost project)
- Support institutional changes via Horizon Europe
- Consider supporting further projects as necessary

European

Commitment 6 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Review and develop research assessment criteria, tools and processes

The Commission will review the criteria, tools and processes for FP10 (starting in 2028) and ensure that these are in line with the principles and commitments of the ARRA.



Commitment 7 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Raise awareness of research assessment reform and provide transparent communication, guidance, and training on assessment criteria and processes as well as their use

The Commission already:

- Widely communicated about the award criteria under Horizon Europe, and its novelties (e.g. Open Science)
- Provided guidance to applicants and peer-reviewers

The Commission will:

 Identify improvements in the guidance and training provided to peerreviewers (R&I Framework Programme)



Commitment 8 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Exchange practices and experiences to enable mutual learning within and beyond the Coalition

The Commission already:

- Co-chairs a CoARA WG on "Improving practices in the assessment of research proposals"
- Initiated a Multilateral Dialogue on Values and Principles for Research and Innovation (R&I) with the aim to work towards a common understanding of principles and values that underpin international R&I cooperation
- Co-chaired a sub-Working Group of the G7
 Open Science Working Group, focused on Research assessment and broader issues of incentives for open science
- Joined the Global Research Council Working Group on Responsible Research Assessment

- Continue to contribute to ongoing initiatives in which it is involved (see left column)
- Work with the European Open Science Cloud on the provision of data, indicators and infrastructural elements underlying research assessment
- Work with the Public Engagement/Citizen Science community to promote and recognize Citizen Science



Commitment 9 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Communicate progress made on adherence to the principles and implementation of the Commitments

The Commission will report on the progress made with this Action Plan within the timeline established in the ARRA.



Commitment 10 of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment (ARRA): Evaluate practices, criteria and tools based on solid evidence and the state-of-the-art in research on research, and make data openly available for evidence gathering and research

The Commission already:

 Initiated the funding of projects that contribute to research assessment reforms (<u>PathOS</u>, <u>OPUS</u>, <u>GraspOS</u>, <u>SciLake</u>)

- Map the projects already funded through Horizon Europe, that contribute to the reform of research assessment
- Identify the main contributions and recommendations from these projects for research assessment reforms and CoARA work
- Identify potential new research and innovation actions needed



CoARA Working Group on the assessment of research proposals

- Improve practices in the assessment of research proposals, ultimately supporting higher quality and more impactful projects
 - ✓ In line with the principles and commitments of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment
 - ✓ While respecting the autonomy of each member
- Lines of work
 - ✓ Criteria for the selection of research projects and innovative procedures (WP1)
 - ✓ Selection of and guidance to **reviewers** on responsible research assessment practices (WP2)
 - ✓ Information requested from applicants (WP3)
 - ✓ Cross-cutting activities: Bibliographic analysis and horizon scanning (WP0); Dissemination of results (WP4)
- Co-chaired by the European Commission, the German Research Foundation (DFG) and Knowledge Foundation Sweden (KKS)
