Of course, a lot of the initiatives and actions I will show you did not start with the Declaration but are a result of a process that started a few years ago, and continues today

What I will show you is how we have mapped these initiatives and actions to the Barcelona Declaration commitments, complementing them with the work we want to continue to do for supporting the goals of the Declaration



### We will make openness the default for the research information we use and produce [Commitment 1]

### **Producing**

All research information about scholarly publications, PhD thesis, and other research outputs (datasets, software, etc.) are available in institutional repositories and services – IRIS (UNIBO CRIS system), AMS Acta (for data), AMS Historica (for cultural heritage materials), AMS <u>Dottorato</u> (for PhD thesis), AlmaDL Books (coming soon) <u>AlmaDL</u> Journals (Diamond OA journal publishing platform) – in CCO and in machine-readable form

All bibliographic metadata about research publications included in IRIS have been recently published in a dump for bulk download

#### Using

we use both the open research information that we produce and that is produced by other external services and infrastructures for several tasks

In the context of research assessment, such open information are currently combined with closed data coming for proprietary services – adopted at the National level



# We will work with services and systems that support and enable open research information [Commitment 2]

We use open source software for implementing all our institutional repositories and services

We use DataCite as external service for obtaining persistent identifiers (DOI) of all the publications and data included in AMS Acta and AlmaDL Journals and for depositing the open research information of these research outputs

We collaborate actively with existing services and infrastructure (e.g. OpenCitations and OpenAIRE) adopting open research information to monitor UNIBO research products and activities, understanding where are the gaps and devising possible strategies to fill them











### We will support the sustainability of infrastructures for open research information [Commitment 3]



OpenCitations (<a href="https://opencitations.net">https://opencitations.net</a>) is an independent not-for-profit infrastructure organization dedicated to the publication of open bibliographic and citation data, managed by the Research Centre for Open Scholarly Metadata at the University of Bologna



It is <u>managed and supported by</u> the scholarly community, institutions, and governments, and currently provides <u>more than 2 billion citation links</u>

- All <u>data published in CCO</u> and available in several machine-readable format (CSV, JSON/Scholix, RDF/N-triples)
- Several <u>REST APIs available</u> for programmatic access
- Technical infrastructure based on <u>open-source software</u>



### **Conclusions**

While several things have been already done, there are still some aspects that should be properly addressed to fully comply with the commitments of the Barcelona Declaration

UNIBO will proceed with a gradual application of the four commitments in line with the organizational needs of the University and in alignment with the national context

#### Expected benefits:

- Experiment with bibliometric data from open sources alongside those of commercial origin still used in national evaluation, providing concrete evidence on the coverage of both
- Contribute to the innovation and development of a more sustainable and transparent information ecosystem to support evaluation, management and business intelligence/scouting activities of research activities
- Direct choices and evolutionary lines in relation to this ecosystem, raising awareness among political decision-makers also through participation in national and international networks and coalitions
