HISTORY OF THE ORIGIN OF VOLLEYBALL SPORT

Abstract. The sport of volleyball was invented by William G. Morgan in 1895 in Massachusetts, USA. Originally called "Mintonette", the game was introduced as a new sport for students in physical education classes. The game was organized using a ball and a wire fence (net). The game soon became popular and reached other countries in the early 1900s. In 1916, the first international tournament was held, and in 1924, the International Volleyball Federation (FIVB) was established. Volleyball was recognized as an official sport at Tokyo Olympics in 1964. Today, volleyball is a widespread sport on a global scale, with many international and regional competitions held every year, fostering team spirit among players and fans. This research covers the main aspects focused on the history of the origin and development of volleyball.

INTRODUCTION

The sport of volleyball originated in the United States, and is now just beginning to achieve the type of popularity in the U.S. that it has received on a global basis, where it ranks behind only soccer among participation sports.

In 1895, <u>William G. Morgan</u>, an instructor at the <u>Young Men's Christian Association</u> (YMCA) in <u>Holyoke</u>, <u>Mass.</u>, decided to blend elements of basketball, baseball, tennis, and handball to create a game for his classes of businessmen which would demand less physical contact than basketball. He created the game of Volleyball (at that time called mintonette).

Per Morgan, the game was fit for the gymnasium or exercise hall but, could also be played outdoor. The play consisted of any number of players keeping a ball in motion from one side to the other over a net raised 6 feet 6 inches above the floor. Play is started by a player on one side serving the ball over the net into the opponents' field or court. The opponents then, without letting the ball strike the floor, return it, and it is in this way kept going back and forth until one side fails to return the ball or the ball hits the floor. The side serving the ball earns points when the opposite side either fails to return the ball or allows the ball to hit the floor.

LITERATURE ANALYSIS AND METHODOLOGY. The game of volleyball, since its invention at the end of the 20th century, has become a very popular sport in the world.

The main stages of the history and development of volleyball can be divided into the following:

Early Stages: The origin of volleyball, its invention and initial rules, is one of the most important processes in the history of the sport. Created by William G. Morgan, the game was originally played in a gym. The rules of the game have evolved over time and become standards.

RESULTS. If we talk about the history of the creation and development of volleyball in Uzbekistan, there is no clear information about when, where and under what circumstances volleyball was created in Uzbekistan. However, according to some estimates, the game of volleyball started to appear in Kokand, Tashkent and Ferghana in 1921-24. According to the story of K. Lebedev, a sports veteran of that time, in 1924-25, the game of passing balls to each other began to spread. The rules of volleyball in Uzbekistan in 1924-25 were still quite simple. V.I. Perevoznikov, a sports enthusiast of that time, said that in 1926, a school teacher named Chemishevsky in Tashkent was in Moscow, he brought the competition rules, volleyball net and ball for the first time. On April 26, 1927, the volleyball team of this school organized the first official competition, in which they showed great skill and became the winner of the competition. This competition discovered a big turning point in the popularization and formation of volleyball. In one of the summer months of 1927, Tashkent city volleyball championship was held, in which 9 volleyball teams participated. The competitions held at the KIM stadium had a great impact on the popularization of volleyball. In 1927, there were 6 volleyball courts in Tashkent.

In October 1941, military training schools were established in all regions, cities and districts of Uzbekistan, and special attention was paid to physical training in their activities. On July 18, 1943, athletes and sports enthusiasts of Uzbekistan celebrated the "Country" Day of bodybuilders. Volleyball competitions dedicated to this date were held at "Pishchevik" stadium.

CONCLUSION. There is a lot of literature and research about the history of the origin of volleyball, its development and global popularity. It is possible to understand the main aspects of the game of volleyball through historical, empirical and statistical analysis. These approaches allow a better understanding of the development of volleyball and its place in society. This game occupies an important place in the history of world sports and plays a great role in the development of teamwork and education of the young generation.
