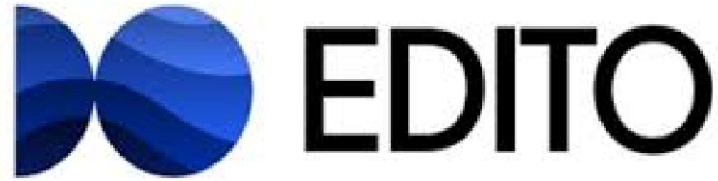

Besides FAIR data, we need **Open data, unrestricted data**, data of guaranteed quality that are flowing with **no restrictions**, except when it is absolutely necessary due to their nature.

The vision of the European Commission is to increase the added value of the investments on ocean observation and marine data by rationalising and optimising these investments.

We need:

More openness between services and initiatives

More collaboration

Less overlap with the goal of no overlap and full synergies

Better communication of the landscape and the role of each initiative in it

Use of stable, open and community-based resources that guarantee no boundaries and no dependencies in what we do, now and in the future
