

## How to read dataset POLTRUST in MLG and CRISIS

This document contains the questions on citizens' political trust in times of crisis, evaluative questions about the Covid-19 pandemic and more general questions that are the basis of the dataset. The survey contains a hypothetical scenario similar to Covid-19 which probes into citizens' trust in different levels of government to take certain crisis measures. We opted for such scenario as it corresponds to real-world events during the 2020-2022 Covid-19 pandemic. The crisis responses sketched by the scenario can therefore also resonate with citizens.

The survey was fielded in June 2023 by the specialized survey company Bilendi in six EU member states – Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, the Netherlands and Spain – totaling 6000 respondents. Respondents were recruited through the large online panels of Bilendi. The dataset also contains a variable to weigh the data per country by age, gender and education (variable “weighing” in the dataset). Respondents that did not consent to participation before or after the survey, did not completely fill in the survey or failed an attention check in the middle of the survey (V019) were excluded to maintain data quality. When a respondent was excluded, new respondents were sought to maintain the 6000 respondents. The following pages explain the structure of the survey and the dataset.

### Block 1. Personal background

### **Block 3. Scenario**

*[order of the measure in the scenario was randomized, some got the restrictive measure in block 3, other the economic support measure]*

A highly contagious and possibly deadly virus is rapidly spreading throughout Europe. The virus has already been found in your country and multiple infections are reported in your region. Research in other countries, where infection rates are high, shows that it affects the whole population and that it spreads through the air. Reports say that there are already deaths that can be attributed to the disease.

In response to this, and to stop the spread of the virus, citizens are not allowed to leave their house unless it is absolutely necessary.

#### **Block 5. Scenario**

A highly contagious and possibly deadly virus is rapidly spreading throughout Europe. The virus has already been found in your country and multiple infections are reported in your region. Research in other countries, where infection rates are high, shows that it affects the whole population and that it spreads through the air. Reports say that there are already deaths that can be attributed to the disease.

People have been unable to go to work because their work or business had to close. To compensate for economic losses caused by measures to fight the spread of the virus, budget for economic support was made available.

### **Block 6. Covid-19 related questions**

14. To what extent do you think governments followed the procedures as prescribed by law when adopting Covid-19 measures? **(V024)**

Scale from "not transparent at all" to "very transparent" (1-7).

16. To what extent did the Covid-19 pandemic impact your life in general? **(V026)**

Scale from "very negatively" to "very positively" (1-7). 4 = "no impact".

"I do not know".

17. To what extent did the Covid-19 pandemic impact your economic situation? **(V026B)**

Scale from "very negatively" to "very positively" (1-7). 4 = "no impact".

"I do not know".

18. To what extent did you perceive the Covid-19 measures as responsive to your needs? **(V027)**

Scale from "not responsive at all" to "very responsive" (1-7).

"I do not know".

19. How satisfied were you with the government's support of the economy during the Covid-19 pandemic? **(V028)**

Scale from "not satisfied at all" to "very satisfied" (1-7).

"I do not know".

20. How satisfied were you with the government's support of households during the Covid-19 pandemic? **(V029)**

Scale from “not satisfied at all” to “very satisfied” (1-7).

21. Finally, we would like to know which of the following values are the most important to you when you think about a government’s management of a crisis?
