Wieacker states he is already in preparation of his 'Privatrechtsgeschichte'. Legal philosophy is not an option, since Wieacker is not particularly interested in that subject. Moreover, his academic duties after the 'Zerstörung' of his institute, as well as the problems of war, prevent him from complying.
