NOTES ON THE ARCHIVAL SOURCE:

It contains 13 letters from different people to Professor Gustav Radbruch and two other documents.

One handwritten letter by Reinhard Werer. One handwritten letter by J.H. Whitehead. Six letters and an article by Alfred Wicher. A ballad written by Franz Villon for Alfred Wicher (three letters are handwritten). Five handwritten letters by Friedrich Wichert. One typewritten letter by Berthold Widmann. One handwritten letter by Franz Wieacker. A reply to the letter by Gustav Radbruch sent to him in February, 27th 1944.

Only a few letters are numbered and the one by Wieacker is not.

A handwritten letter by Franz Wieacker to Gustav Radbruch, that the first wrote in April, the 2^{nd} 1944, when he was in Leipzig. The letter is on one sheet, written recto and verso.

A large part of the letter is unintelligible. Anyway, at the beginning Wieacker hints to a Gedächtnisrede in honor of Rudolf von Jhering. He writes also something about the possibility to find some letters by Windscheid in a library [Tommaso Beggio: I really don't understand which is this library].

At the end of the letter he focuses on the problem of finding books in the library and in the Römanistisches Seminar in Leipzig.
