Kiraņa introduction

Manuscripts and edition:

For uniformity, I have based the notation upon that adopted by Dominic Goodall in his 1998 edition. In the introduction to Goodall's edition a fuller description of the manuscripts is given.

M2c IFI 0401. Copy of M2 (Adyar Library, Madras MS 39 C 8 / TR 608, completed by 1928). Devanāgarī on paper. 22 lines to a side.
E (Goodall E_D) Devakoțțai edition of the *Kiraṇa*, 1932. An edition made from 4 manuscripts, which are not listed. Printed grantha.

Where G3 is available to me, I refer to its devanāgarī copy, G3c, only in emergencies. The fact that G3 and G3c often disagree (for example, at 55.7a, G3 reads garbha, G3c reads gandha) makes me treat the latter with caution. I am using M1c and M2c until I can obtain a copy of M1 and M2. In the apparatus I will use M to denote both M1c and M2c when they read alike, and G to denote G2 and G3 when they read alike.

The following apograph of N was not consulted for the edition. NAK 4.13. NGMPP reel number B117/11. Paper, Newari script. Nepalīyasamvat 819 (1699CE).

Stemma: Ω = N G M Evidence for stemma: Only N reports 55.49ab and 19.3a-5b Only G2 reports 55. 28d-30a. M lacks 55.13c-15d. G3,(G3c),M and E lack 55.16c-18d. E regularly patches over difficulty with altogether different text: for example, at 54.7b and d.

The Nepalese text has no pāda divisions. The pāda divisions in the other manuscripts are a later and awkward superimposition that I shall not follow (see Goodall 1998, pp. lviii ff.)
