The colophon of F reads: ity āgneye mahātantre pratiṣṭātantraṃ mohacūrottaraṃ samāptaṃ | saṃvat 806 | phālgunavadi 10 | bhaume | śrīmadbhogalekharamaṭhāvasthitapaṇḍitācāryabhaṭṭārakaśrīsarvagaṇena pustakaṃ likhitam iti

The *Mohacūrottara Pratiṣṭhātantra*, in the *Āgneya Mahātantra*, finished in the year 806 (1686?), on Tuesday, the 10th day of the month Phālguna, was written by the scholar Śrīsarvagaṇa, of the Śrīmadbhogalekhara school.

The colophon at H repeats that at F and adds further material.

Stemma: $\Omega = F(\rightarrow H)G$

H is a copy of F. It is useful where F is illegible due to worm damage.

G has some independence from F, and is less reliable. It is incomplete. At G, chapter 4 is lacking after verse 117a.
