1. 14. In God's name. Account of miscellaneous taxes for the village of Aphrodito in the 5th indiction.

Village of Aphrodito.

- Hathyr 29. For part of a sailor for I month, for Clysma, (to sail) to Raithu, by letter of the all-honoured Governor, in person, 1/3 sailor 2).
 - Same day. For part of the allowance to the *Muhājirūn*, 400 artabas of wheat for the household slaves of the all-honoured Governor, by Victor son of Symeon, 8 s.
 - Choiach 4. For part of I labourer for I month, for the building of the fortress of Babylon, by Paeon the sailor from Antaeopolis, 5/6 s.
 - Choiach 15. For the price of 182 artabas of wheat, for the allowance to the *Muhājirūn*, from the arrears of the *embola* for the 3rd indiction, by Victor son of Symeon, 4.13/24 s.
 - Same day. For the allowance (?) by the Amīr-al-Mu'minīn, 133 s.
 - Same day. For supplies for Clysma, by Ezekiel son of Psempnuthius, loaves, 20 artabas; oil, 2 measures.
 - Same day. For freight on the ship and the wages of the said Ezekiel, 2 s.
 - Same day. For articles requisitioned for the *carabi* which are in the island of Babylon, by Senuthius the supercargo (?) from Aphrodito, 15 s.

- Same day. For carriage by 2 camels, and wages and supplies of I camel-driver, viz. for 2 camels, $4^2/_3$ s., for I camel-driver, I s. Total, $5^2/_3$ s.
- Same day. For freight and wages and exchange of money, by Senuthius the supercargo (?), son of Enoch, from Aphrodito, I¹/₂ s.
- Choiach 21. For a shift of iron-workers for 3 months from Hathyr 6 to Mecheir 6, by Senuthius the supercargo (?): for 2 labourers, $4^{1}/2$ s.
- Same day. For 1/2 sawyer for I month, for work ordered by the *Amīr al-Mu'minīn* at Babylon, by Senuthius, 5/6 s.
- Choiach 24. For I labourer for 12 months, for the new building of the Amīr al-Mu'minīn at Jerusalem, with 1/2 s. for maintenance bought (?) by Senuthius the supercargo (?), 6 1/2 s. And I labourer in person, by the (said) Senuthius.
- Tybi I. For skilled workmen and labourers, for the *carabi*, for 4 months, by Senuthius the supercargo (?), in person 2 carpenters, $2^{I}/4$ labourers.
- Tybi 5. For 15 cloven palm-trunks, for the building of the palace of the Amir al-Mu'minin at Babylon, by Senuthius the supercargo (?), $7^{1/2}$ s.
- Tybi 8. For the wages and supplies of Horuonchius the accountant for 12 months from Hathyr 6, 4th ind., to Hathyr 5, 5th ind., by Horuonchius, 6 s.
- Tybi 23. For 3 arouras of standing fodder at I s. each, and the wages of a chief stableman, I person, for I2 months, for the post-horses of Mounachthe, by Rashīd, 5 s.

- Mecheir 8. For part of the wages of a blacksmith and the price of firewood required for the manufacture of 2 quintals of nails at 2 s., by Philotheus son of Menas, 4 s.
- —— For I currier for 20 days, for work at the tent of the Amīr al-Mu'minīn which is being made at Babylon, by Senuthius son of Enoch, I s.
- Same day. For I caulker and I carpenter for 4 months, for the

- repair of the *carabi* which are in the island of Babylon, by Philotheus son of Menas the priest, 4 s.
- For 1/2 man for 8 months, with his supplies, for the construction of the mosque of Damascus, in person, by Enoch son of Theod(), $2^{1/4}$ s.
- Same day. For 2 labourers, for a shist of ironworkers for 3 months, from Mecheir 6 to Pachon 6, and for their supplies, viz. $2^{1/4}$ s., $4^{1/2}$ s.
- Mecheir 22. For sailors for the raiding fleet of the Orient, with their supplies, for 6 months, viz. by money composition for 2 months, in kind for 4 months, by Senuthius the supercargo (?). 8 sailors with their supplies for 4 months in kind and for 2 months by money composition, with 1/2 s. for provisions (on the journey), 12 s.
- Same day. For freight and the wages of Senuthius the supercargo (?) and 'Abd al-Raḥmān the courier, s.
- Phamenoth 4. For arrears of supplies for the raiding fleet of Egypt, by Athanasius the supercargo (?), 20 artabas of loaves.

 —— For the money composition for milk, $4^{1/2}$ s.
- Pharmouthi 2. For part of 79 sailors for the raiding fleet of Egypt, with their supplies for I month, as provisions (on the journey), by Elias the soldier, 31 sailors.
- Same day. For their fare on the ship which carried them, by Basil son of Apa Cyrus the sailor from Antaeopolis, s.
- —— For supplies for 31 sailors for 7 months, with part (of the quota) of the hamlet of Psyrus, viz. per sailor 7 artabas of loaves, 11/6 artaba of pulse, 7 xestae of oil, 7 xestae of sour wine, 13/4 collatha of salt, by Apa Cyrus son of Andrew the supercargo (?).
- For supplies for the *Muhājirūn* and *mawālī*, 100 artabas of wheat, $8^{1}/_{3}$ s.; 50 measures of boiled wine, $12^{1}/_{2}$ s. Total $205/_{6}$ s.
- For freight on the ship which carried 79 sailors and their supplies for 7 months, namely (the sailors hired) by Basil from Antaeopolis and Macarius from Apotheke, with 12/3 s. expended by Apa Cyrus the supercargo (?) for 15 artabas of loaves, 51/3 s.
- Pharmouthi 8. For I sailor for 8 months, for the ships of Clysma, namely (the sailor hired) by David son of Andrew, in person, from this place, I person.

Pharmouthi 16. For freight on the ship which carried the first Islam. III.

- instalment of taxes for the 4th indiction and the wages of the Saracen who came for the same taxes and the wages of the man sent with them, 4 s.
- Pachon 5. For $7^2/3$ sailors, for the raiding fleet of Egypt and that of the Orient, with their supplies for 6 months, viz. by money composition for 2 months, in kind for 4 months, by Peter the supercargo (?).
 - For the raiding fleet of Egypt, $3^{1}/_{3}$ sailors, with their supplies for 6 months in kind, and for the $Muh\bar{a}jir\bar{u}n$, 6 measures of boiled wine, $1^{1}/_{2}$ s.
 - For the raiding fleet of the Orient, $4^{1}/_{3}$ sailors, with their supplies for 6 months, viz. in kind for 4 months, by money composition for 2 months, $4^{1}/_{3}$ s.
- Pachon —. For 2 labourers for a shift of ironworkers for 3 months, by Paeon the sailor, $4^{1/2}$ s.
- Pachon 7. For part of the supplies for porters (?), namely (those hired) by Shuraih b. Al-Wāṣil, for 4 months, 20 artabas of barley, 5/6 s.; 20 quintals of chaff, 1/2 s. Total, 11/3 s.
- Pachon 9. For part of the freight on the ship which carried various articles for the *carabi* and Clysma, by Peter the priest and Abu Yazīd, 12 s.
- —— 14. For part of the price of hides for covering the two-banked *carabi* which are in the island of Babylon, by Paeon the sailor, I¹/₂ s.
- Payni 4. For part of the wages of a blacksmith and the price of I quintal of firewood, for the manufacture of nails, by Peter the supercargo (?), I s.
- Payni 5. For part of the supplies for Atyat b. Ayou $\pi\alpha$ and his companions, 4 persons, for preparing the register of acacias for part of 4 months, $^2/_3$ s.
- Same day. For the torches of the Amīr al-Mu'minīn which are being made at Alexandria, by Victor the sailor, (taken) by Padose, 50 litrae of wax, 15/12 s.
- Same day. For part of 8 men for 3 months, for the dykes of Tepythis, in person, by Athanasius son of Paul the supercargo (?), 3¹/₂ persons.
- Same day. For their fare and that of 14 sailors, by Phoebammon son of Agathon the sailor, $\frac{2}{3}$ s.
- Payni 19. For part of the supplies for the all-honoured Governor, for 12 months, by Enoch son of Victor the supercargo (?) from Pakaunis, 50²/₃ s.

- Same day. For freight on the ship which carried them and the wages of Enoch and exchange of money, by the same Enoch, $\frac{2}{3}$ s.
- Payni 21. For part of the wages of Nemesion and Sarapion the builders from the village of Onouphis, by Enoch the supercargo (?), 1/2 s.
- Payni 29. For supplies for us and our companions on the journey to Alexandria, 70 artabas of wheat.
- Same day. For the canals and dykes of our village of Aphrodito, out of (a total contingent of) 34 labourers, 24 labourers.
- Epeiph 8. For part of the wages and supplies of I blacksmith for 6 months, for the repair of the 2 ships which were injured, viz. for 1/2 blacksmith, by Enoch son of Victor the supercargo (?), 5 1/2 s.
- For the *embola* of the 5th indiction, by Apollôs the priest, 500 artabas of wheat.
- Mecheir 15. For articles requisitioned for Clysma, by Enoch son of Victor the supercargo (?) from Pakaunis, 10¹/₂ s.
- Mesore 25. For chains of beaten (tin?), 30 litrae, at $4^{I}/_{3}$ s. and of molten tin (?), 10 litrae, at I s., for work ordered, by Enoch; total, $5^{I}/_{3}$ s.
- Intercalary Days, I. For I cobbler for 2 months, for Abou Anoube, given to Enoch the supercargo (?) by the cobblers of the place, $3^{1/3}$ s.
- Intercalary Days, I. For part of 40 skilled workmen for the construction of the mosque of Damascus, by Enoch the supercargo (?), 2 s.
- Thoth 2. For part of the wages and supplies of I letter-carrier for 4 months, viz. 1/2 letter-carrier, I s.
 - —— 21.—For freight on the ship which carried the Ist instalment of the public taxes and the wages of the Saracen who came for the public taxes, 2 s.
 - Same day. For a shift of ironworkers at Babylon for 3 months, viz. for 2 labourers to make up (the full term of) 12 months, by Enoch son of Victor the supercargo (?), $4^{1/2}$ s.
 - For the \dots s.
