Repository Investigation Exercise

- Branding: Is the university/institution able to incorporate its own branding?
- Look and feel: Does the user interface feel fresh and current or stale/clunky?
- Content: what kinds of content are included in the repository?
 Do some content types work better than others?
- About the Repository: Is there a scope note? A statement about the organization/institution that runs the repository? Is it easy to tell what's included in the repository?
 - Is this an institutional repository, a subject repository, or another kind of OA repository?
- Metadata: is Dublin Core used? Is another metadata schema used? Are any controlled vocabularies employed?





Repository Investigation Exercise

- About the Repository Services: Is there a note describing the services offered by the team that supports the repository?
- Help: Is contact information provided? Suggestions on whom to contact for assistance?
- **Statistics:** Are page views, downloads, or other type of usage statistics displayed? Are altmetrics displayed on articles?
- Languages: Is the repository platform available in multiple languages? Are there any key language limitations?
- Harvesting: Does the repository indicate where its content is harvested?
- Does the repository website showcase any researchers, articles, or other content?
- Are there any unusual features offered by this repository?

Step 2: Confirm account (through link via email)




