

In Memoriam.

SIR WILLIAM OSLER, BART., M.D., F.R.S.;

REGIUS PROFESSOR OF MEDICINE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD;
HON. FELLOW OF THE ROYAL COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS OF IRELAND.

SIR WILLIAM OSLER died at his residence, Norham Gardens, Oxford, on Monday, December 29, 1919, aged 70½ years, after an illness of more than two months, the end coming suddenly at the last. He was a Canadian by birth, having been born at Bond Head, Ontario, on July 12, 1849.

"Multis ille bonis flebilis occidit."

The following Resolution was passed in solemn silence, all present standing, at a meeting of the President and Fellows of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland, held on Friday, January 2nd, 1920:—

"RESOLVED: that the President and Fellows of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland have heard with deep sorrow of the death of their beloved colleague Sir William Osler.

"Throughout the whole civilised world Sir William had by his work won respect and admiration, while the charm of his personality had made him beloved by a host of friends.

"The people of Ireland are specially indebted to him for the generous way in which he placed his splendid gifts at their disposal in the furtherance of all matters affecting the public health.

"By his colleagues in this College, of which he was an Honorary Fellow since 1905, he was particularly beloved and honoured, and now is deeply mourned.

"The President and Fellows desire to convey to Lady Osler their sincere sympathy, and to assure her that in the fullest sense they share in her great loss."
