LIVERSEGE CHURCH.

CHRIST CHURCH, Liversedge, was built by the Rev. Hammond Roberson, and is very beautifully situated on a knoll, on the opposite side of the valley to his own house. It was erected entirely at his own expense, and he left a most detailed statement of the cost, which was so nicely balanced that he even accounted for the farthings. (£7474 11s. 10<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>d.)

The church was consecrated on August 29th, 1816.

A plain headstone in the churchyard bears the following inscription:—"The Rev. Hammond Roberson, founder of this Church in 1816, died August 9th, 1841, aged 84.
