Operative access conditions

- Guest room with a PC workstation
 - Located at room 109, first floor at IRCrES seat
- Arrangements for computer environment
 - RISIS account for visiting researchers with access code (password)
 - MS Access 2013 license
- Selective access
 - No access to IRCrES network



Prevention of unauthorized data transfer

- No internet, no e-mail programmes
- USB ports for will be disabled
- Guest researcher will be allowed to use a **private notebook** that facilitates the communication via e-mail, internet research, the use of Office-programmes and printing
- The **storage of (preliminary) results** (e.g. tables, graphics) for the purpose of further processing/finishing elsewhere may only be carried out by the local dataset team



Access to building and office

- Guest researchers can enter IRCRES only during general working hours (from 8:00 am to 7:30 pm)
- Other people are only allowed to accompany the guest researcher after this has been agreed upon
- Contacting local dataset team prior to the research visit via email to specifying the individual research interest as well as the time and duration of the visit



Preliminary procedure

- Information on the dataset (e.g. data documentation, metadata) on RISIS platform and RISIS website
- Visit requests via <http://risis.eu/data/>
 - Interested researchers will have to undertake a two-step process: **accreditation** (through signing the charter of good practice), and **selection** of the project they intend to develop (through a review by the relevant dataset producers and by the RISIS project review board)



RISIS Code of Conduct

- Code of Conduct (CoD) applies to all researchers entering the RISIS infrastructure and provides help and orientation on
 - basic principles and research ethics,
 - authentication via ORCID ID,
 - proper use and share of data,
 - publish results and post on RISIS website,
 - acknowledge RISIS,
 - reporting,
 - financial conditions

Feasibility issue

- Researchers can select a set of variables and send it to the local dataset team asking for feasibility
- Local dataset team decides whether the data set is suitable to answer the respective research question(s) and/or makes suggestions
- Local dataset team could generate an individualized dataset after having reached an agreement with the guest researcher on the use of specific variables and checks the number of cases



NDA and organization of the visit

- Signing of user contract and local non-disclosure agreement
- Organization of research visit (travel and accommodation) by guest researcher
 - Regular consultation times
 - Maximum period of research visit: 1 week
 - Different conditions can be agreed upon specific requests
