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2. Why the Self-Assessment in 2018?

- 2014-2018: we achieved our initial objectives but conditions evolve
- We needed to
 - Update road map documents
 - Identify gaps in support provision
 - Meet higher demands on the RDM Services







Advantages

- Saving time
- Maintaining to a standardized procedure
- Taking part in international discussions

Disadvantage

 It is not tailor-made for German specifics

3. Experiences

- Acceptance through DCC's high reputation
- RISE-questionnaire provides helpful guidance throughout the process
- Challenge: achieving consensus
 - Are we level 1- 2- 3? Do we want to reach the next level? What would be necessary?

Findings

- Excellent result: In most areas, we are approaching level two.
- Our strengths: Advisory services
- Room for improvement:
- Gaining expertise in legal advice for RDM
- Strengthening RDM in important organisational workflows, for example
 - Reviewing (Collaborative) Research Proposals
 - doctoral supervision agreements




What I Missed
