The DREAMS Databases and Assessment Algorithm

During the DREAMS project, we collected a large amount of polysomnographic recordings (PSG) to tune, train and test our automatic detection algorithms.

These recordings were annotated in microevents or in sleep stages by several experts. They were acquired in a sleep laboratory of a Belgium hospital using a digital 32-channel polygraph (BrainnetTM System of MEDATEC, Brussels, Belgium). The standard European Data Format (EDF) was used for storing.

In order to facilitate future research and performance comparision, we decided to publish these data on Internet. Therefore, eight DREAMS databases are available according to the annotation carried out (click on the link to open):

- The DREAMS Subjects Database : 20 whole-night PSG recordings coming from healthy subjects, annoted in sleep stages according to both the Rechtschaffen and Kales criteria and the new standard of the American Academy of Sleep Medicine;
- The DREAMS Patients Database: 27 whole-night PSG recordings coming from patients with various pathologies, annoted in sleep stages according to both the Rechtschaffen and Kales criteria and the new standard of the American Academy of Sleep Medicine;
- The DREAMS Artifacts Database: 20 excerpts of 15 minutes of PSG recordings annoted in artifacts (cardiac interference, slow ondulations, muscle artifacts, failing electrode, 50/60Hz main interference, saturations, abrupt transitions, EOG interferences and artifacts in EOG) by an expert;
- The DREAMS Sleep Spindles Database: 8 excerpts of 30 minutes of central EEG channel (extracted from whole-night PSG recordings), annotated independently by two experts in sleep spindles;
- The DREAMS K-complexes Database: 5 excerpts of 30 minutes of central EEG channel (extracted from whole-night PSG recordings), annotated independently by two experts in K-complexes;
- The DREAMS REMs Database: 9 excerpts of 30 minutes of PSG recordings in which rapid eye movements were annotated by an expert;
- The DREAMS PLMs Database: 10 whole-night PSG recordings coming from patients in which one of the two tibialis EMG was annoted in periodic limb movements by an expert;
- The DREAMS Apnea Database: 12 whole-night PSG recordings coming from patients annoted in respiratory events (central, obstructive and mixed apnea and hypopnea) by an expert.

We also developed and tested several automatic procedures to detect micro-events such as sleep spindles, K-complexes, REMS, etc. and provide the source codes for them in the DREAMS Assessment Algorithm package.

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The DREAMS Subjects Database

Database description

Data collected were acquired in a sleep laboratory of a belgium hospital using a digital 32-channel polygraph (BrainnetTM System of MEDATEC, Brussels, Belgium). They consist of 20 whole-night polysomnographic recordings, coming from 20 healthy subjects. At least two EOG channels (P8-A1, P18-A1), three EEG channels (CZ-A1 or C3-A1, FP1-A1 and O1-A1) and one submental EMG channel were recorded. The standard European Data Format (EDF) was used for storing. The sampling frequency was 200Hz.

These recordings have been specifically selected for their clarity (i.e. that they contain few artifacts) and come from persons, free of any medication, volunteers in other research projects, conducted in the sleep lab.

The sleep stage classification according to the Rechtschaffen and Kales (R&K) criteria has been made on the basis of epochs 20 seconds, while the scoring according to the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM) criteria has been completed (nearly two years later) based on epochs of 30 seconds. Both annotations were produced visually by a single expert of the sleep laboratory.

The DREAMS Patients Database

This Patients database was collected during the DREAMS project, to tune, train and test our automatic sleep stages classification algorithms.

It consist of 27 whole-night PSG recordings coming from patients with various pathologies, annoted in sleep stages according to both the Rechtschaffen and Kales (R&K) criteria and the new standard of the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM).

Database description

Data collected were acquired in a sleep laboratory of a belgium hospital using a digital 32-channel polygraph (BrainnetTM System of MEDATEC, Brussels, Belgium). They consist of 27 whole-night polysomnographic recordings, coming from patients with various pathologies (diseases suffered by these patients are given in Table below).

At least two EOG channels (P8-A1, P18-A1), three EEG channels (CZ-A1 or C3-A1, FP1-A1 and O1-A1) and one submental EMG channel were recorded. The standard European Data Format (EDF) was used for storing. The sampling frequency was 200Hz. Corresponding physiological signals can be particularly contaminated by artifacts (notably due to the numerous movements of the sleeper during the night).

The sleep stage classification according to the Rechtschaffen and Kales (R&K) criteria has been made on the basis of epochs 20 seconds, while the scoring according to the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM) criteria has been completed (nearly two years later) based on epochs of 30 seconds. Both annotations were produced visually by a single expert of the sleep laboratory.

Database description


Data collected were acquired in a sleep laboratory of a belgium hospital using a digital 32-channel polygraph (BrainnetTM System of MEDATEC, Brussels, Belgium). They consist of 20 polysomnographic recordings coming from patients with different pathologies (dysomnia, restless legs syndrome, insomnia, apnoea/hypopnoea syndrome). Two EOG channels (P8-A1, P18-A1), three EEG channels (CZ-A1 or C3-A1, FP1-A1 and O1-A1) and one submental EMG channel were recorded. The standard European Data Format (EDF) was used for storing. The sampling frequency was 200Hz, 100Hz or 50Hz. An excerpt of 15 minutes was extracted from each of these recordings to be annotated in artifacts by an expert. These excerpts were voluntarily withdrawn at various times of the night, in order to diversify the background of the physiological signals observed (depending on sleep stage considered). The corresponding whole-night recordings were also previously scored in sleep stages according to the Rechtschaffen and Kales criteria, but no note of these stages quotations was given to the scorers.

















A summary of the recordings contents in artifacts is presented below. Unfortunately, no saturation has been reported by the expert in this database. We also note that only one period of EEG was annotated as corrupted by a network interference. However, this is hardly surprising given that the Medatec acquisition system already includes filters to eliminate these spurious frequencies.

The DREAMS Sleep Spindles Database

This Sleep Spindles database was collected during the DREAMS project, to tune, train and test our automatic detection algorithms.

It consist of 8 excerpts of 30 minutes of central EEG channel (extracted from whole-night PSG recordings), annotated independently by two experts in sleep spindles.

In order to facilitate future research and performance comparision, we decided to publish these data on Internet. Database description

The data were acquired in a sleep laboratory of a belgium hospital using a digital 32-channel polygraph (BrainnetTM System of MEDATEC, Brussels, Belgium). They consist of height polysomnographic recordings coming from patients with different pathologies (dysomnia, restless legs syndrome, insomnia, apnoea/hypopnoea syndrome). Two EOG channels (P8-A1, P18-A1), three EEG channels (CZ-A1 or C3-A1, FP1-A1 and O1-A1) and one submental EMG channel were recorded. The standard European Data Format (EDF) was used for storing. The sampling frequency was 200Hz, 100Hz or 50Hz. A segment of 30 minutes of the central EEG channel was extracted from each whole-night recording for spindles scoring. No effort was made to select good spindle epochs or noise free epochs, in order to reflect reality as well as possible. These excerpts were given independently to two experts for sleep spindles scoring. The second expert only scored the 6 first excerpts. The corresponding whole night recordings were also previously scored in sleep stages according to the Rechtschaffen and Kales criteria, but no note of these stages quotations was given to the scorers.

- Visual_scoring2_excerpt.txt: is a textual file containing, in first line, the name of the detection and then 2 columns of numerical values. The first column contains time instants (in second) corresponding to the beginnings of the micro-events scored by the expert 2 (from the beginning of the excerpt), and the second one contains their durations (in second).

Overview and Development of a Standard Proposal Assessment Method

The DREAMS K-complexes Database

This K-complexes database was collected during the DREAMS project, to tune, train and test our automatic detection algorithms.

It consist of 10 excerpts of 30 minutes of central EEG channel (extracted from whole-night PSG recordings), annotated independently by two experts in K-complexes.

In order to facilitate future research and performance comparision, we decided to publish these data on Internet. Be simply aware that this DREAMS K-complexes Database of University of MONS - TCTS Laboratory (Stéphanie Devuyst, Thierry Dutoit) and Université Libre de Bruxelles - CHU de Charleroi Sleep Laboratory (Myriam Kerkhofs) is under terms of the Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivs 3.0 Unported (CC BY-NC-ND 3.0) License. Database description

Data were acquired in a sleep laboratory of a belgium hospital using a digital 32-channel polygraph (BrainnetTM System of MEDATEC, Brussels, Belgium). They consist of 10 polysomnographic recordings coming from healthy subjects. Two EOG channels (P8-A1, P18-A1), three EEG channels (CZ-A1 or C3-A1, FP1-A1 and O1-A1) and one submental EMG channel were recorded. The standard European Data Format (EDF) was used for storing. The sampling frequency was 200Hz. A segment of 30 minutes of the central EEG channel was extracted from each whole-night recording for K-complexes scoring. These excerpts were given independently to two experts with the following recommendation regarding this annotation:

- K-complex must be a biphasic wave composed of a first negative sharp wave immediately followed by a slower positive component.

- It can occur isolated or by pair.
- It can be associated with spindles (before, after, or on it).
- Its duration should be at least 0.5s and no more than 1.5s.
- Its amplitude should be at least twice as high as the EEG background.
- The amplitude of the negative component should be at least 50% of the positive amplitude component.

- The minimum interval between successive K-complexes in slow wave sleep should be greater than 2s. The corresponding whole night recordings were also previously scored in sleep stages according to the Rechtschaffen and Kales criteria, but no note of these stages quotations was given to the scorers. Unfortunately, the second expert has only annotated the first five excerpts.

The standard European Data Format (EDF) was used for storing. The sampling frequency was 200Hz or 50Hz. On each of these recordings, all leg movements of one of the two tibialis EMG were annoted by an expert. The criteria used were those of the American Sleep Disorder Association (ASDA), Without taking into account the periodic aspect and the distinction between awaking movement or not. The recordings were also previously scored in sleep stages according to the Rechtschaffen and Kales criteria, but no note of these stages cotations was given to the scorer during the PLMS annotation.

The DREAMS Assessment algorithm

During the DREAMS project, we developped and tested several automatic procedures to detect microevents such as sleep spindles, K-complexes, REMS, etc.

Unfortunately, we observed that perfomances completed in the same field by other authors were hardly comparable because their methodology, their databases and their assessment methods were radically different.

To solve this problem and allow evaluation and comparison between other future works, we made our database, our visual scorings and our automatic scorings freely available on the web. In addition, we proposed a unique assessment method using a well defined terminology and from which it is possible to establish all the desired confusion matrices. This assessment method is presented below and the corresponding algorithm, implemented under Matlab, can be downloaded in this repository.

Assessment method

Our assessment algorithm can take into account the visual scoring of one or two experts.




Fig. 1. Illustration of the various possible coverings between the diverse micro-events scored by expert 1 (Vis1), scored by expert 2 (Vis2) and automatically detected (Aut).

Knowing the start time and duration of the annotated micro-events (on one hand, visually and on the other hand, by the automatic algorithm), it identifies the quantity of each possible covering as illustrated on Fig. 1. These various possible configurations are gathered in 4 categories: type T1 (A, B, or C) corresponds to a correct automatic detection since at least one of the two experts has scored the event like such; type T2 corresponds to a false detection; type T3 (A, B, C, or D) corresponds to a missing detection with respect to one or both experts; and type T5 (A, B, or C) corresponds to multiple coverings implying automatic detection.

Once the number of these various types is known, it is easy to deduce the number of true positive (#TP), the number of false positive (#FP) and the number of false negative (#FN) of the different confusion matrixes (see table I). Moreover, the number of true negative (#TN) can be aproximate by (the total duration of the excerpt/the average duration of the micro-event) - (number of true positives + number of false negatives).

Finally, it is easy to deduce from these confusion matrices, the parameters commonly used in literature namely:

• The total agreement rate:

agreement rate =
$$\frac{(\#TP + \#TN)}{(\#TP + \#TN + \#FP + \#FN)}$$

• The sensitivity, representing the probability that the automatic detection algorithm gives a positive result in the presence of a reference annotation:

$$sensitivity = TPrate = \frac{\#TP}{(\#TP + \#FN)}$$

• The specificity, representing the probability the automatic detection algorithm gives negative result in absence of any reference annotation:

$$specificity = \frac{\#TN}{(\#FP + \#TN)}$$

• The false positive rate:

$$FPrate = 1 - specificity = \frac{\#FP}{(\#FP + \#TN)}$$

• The proportion of false detections compared to the actual number of micro-events (according to the expert):

$$FP proportion = \frac{\# FP}{(\# TP + \# FN)}$$

• The amount of false alarms among all automatic detections:

$$FPamount = \frac{\# FP}{(\# TP + \# FP)}$$

Algorithms inputs and outputs

Algorithms for the assessment method has been developped under Matlab.

• Function assessmentMethod.m compare the automatic and visual annotations of one type of micro-event, carried out on one exerpt.

Inputs:

Function assessmentMethod.m uses as inputs files whose format is the same as those proposed in our <u>public databases</u> :

* filename_edf : filename of the polysomnographic recording (in the European Data Format) from which the annoted channel is extracted.

* filename_Automatic_detection : filename of a textual file containing, in the first line, the name

of the detection and then, 2 columns with the beginnings (first column) and durations (second column) of the automatically detected micro-events (in second).

* filename_Visual_scoring1 : filename of a textual file containing, in the first line, the name of the detection and then, 2 columns with the beginnings (first column) and durations (second column) of the visually scored micro-events by expert 1 (in second).

* filename_Visual_scoring2 : filename of a textual file containing, in the first line, the name of the detection and then, 2 columns with the beginnings (first column) and durations (second column) of the visually scored micro-events by expert 2 (in second). If this second annotation is not available, use filename_Visual_scoring2=".

* filename_Hypnogram: filename of a textual file containing from the second line the hypnogram information, with one value per 5 sec.

*duration_event: is the average duration (in second) of the micro-event detected (for the approximation of the True Negative number #TN) in confusion matrixes.

Outputs:

Function assessmentMethod.m returns a structure "nbr_types" with the following fields:

* nbr_types.nbrtot_scored_by_system = total number of events scored by the automatic system, in each stages (wake,REM,S1,S2,S3,S4), and in total (=> vector with 7 values).

* nbr_types.nbrtot_scored_by_visual1 = total number of events scored by the expert 1, in each stages (wake,REM,S1,S2,S3,S4), and in total.

• Function global_assessmentMethod compute the global results of the assessmentMethod applied to a set of excerpts.

Inputs:

Function global_assessmentMethod used as input:

- * filepath: pathway of the files of the database.
- * indice_excerpts: vector with the index of the considered excerpts.
- * duration_event: the average duration (in second) of the microevent detected (for the approximation of the True Negative number #TN).

Outputs:

Function global_assessmentMethod returns the same outputs as the function assessmentMethod.m (but where the values were summed over all exerpts).
