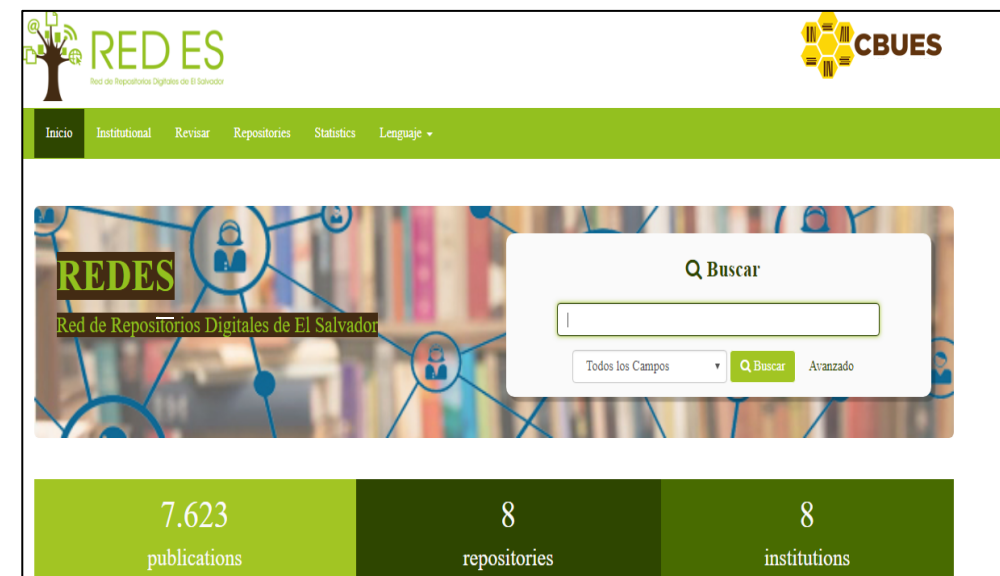
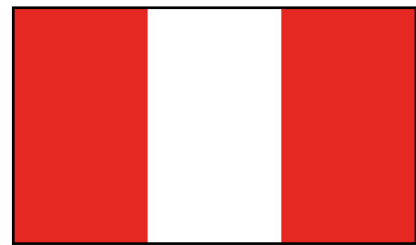
- Mission:

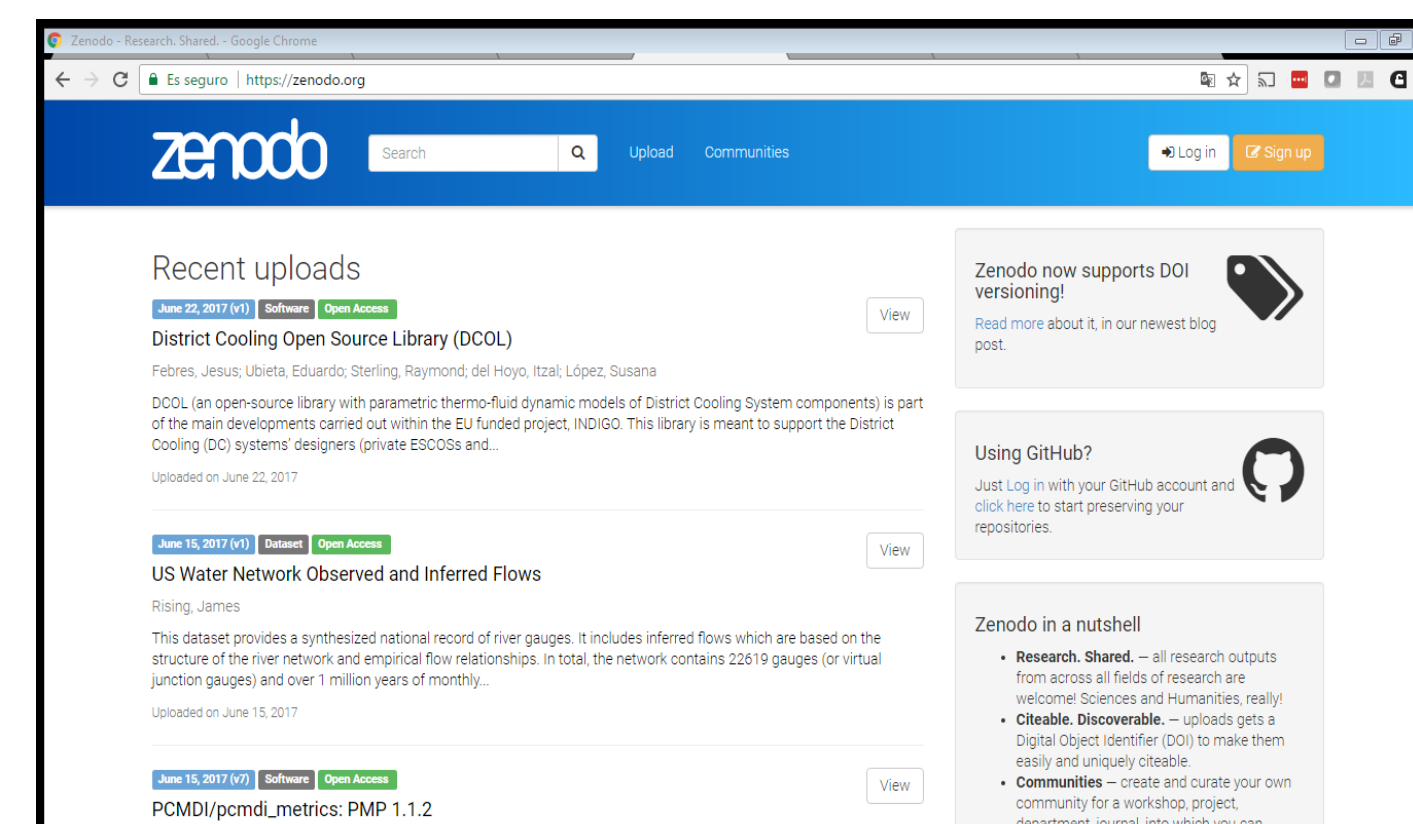
MoU LA Referencia / Zenodo (October 2018)

“This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets for the terms and understanding between Zenodo and LA Referencia to foster open science and facilitate the use of Zenodo as a data repository for Latin American researchers. Specially for the results of R & D financed totally or partially with public funds.”

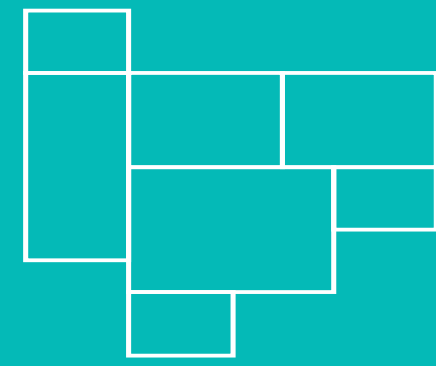
Objetives

- Promote the use of Zenodo as a non-commercial alternative for preserving and providing access to research data in Latin America, and initiate pilots with this infrastructure with an emphasis on results financed with public funds.
- Investigate the best technical alternatives for interoperability between Zenodo and LA Reference services.
- Explore the alternatives for technology transfer between Europe and Latin America related to scientific data.



Lessons

- Focus and work
- Outputs and outcomes
- Understanding of context and challenges
- Adapt to regional and political conditions the service model.
- **Build local (national / regional) capacity to really sustain the efforts and collaborate more effectively (...and takes time...).**
- Support technical teams
- Language / distance still is a barrier
