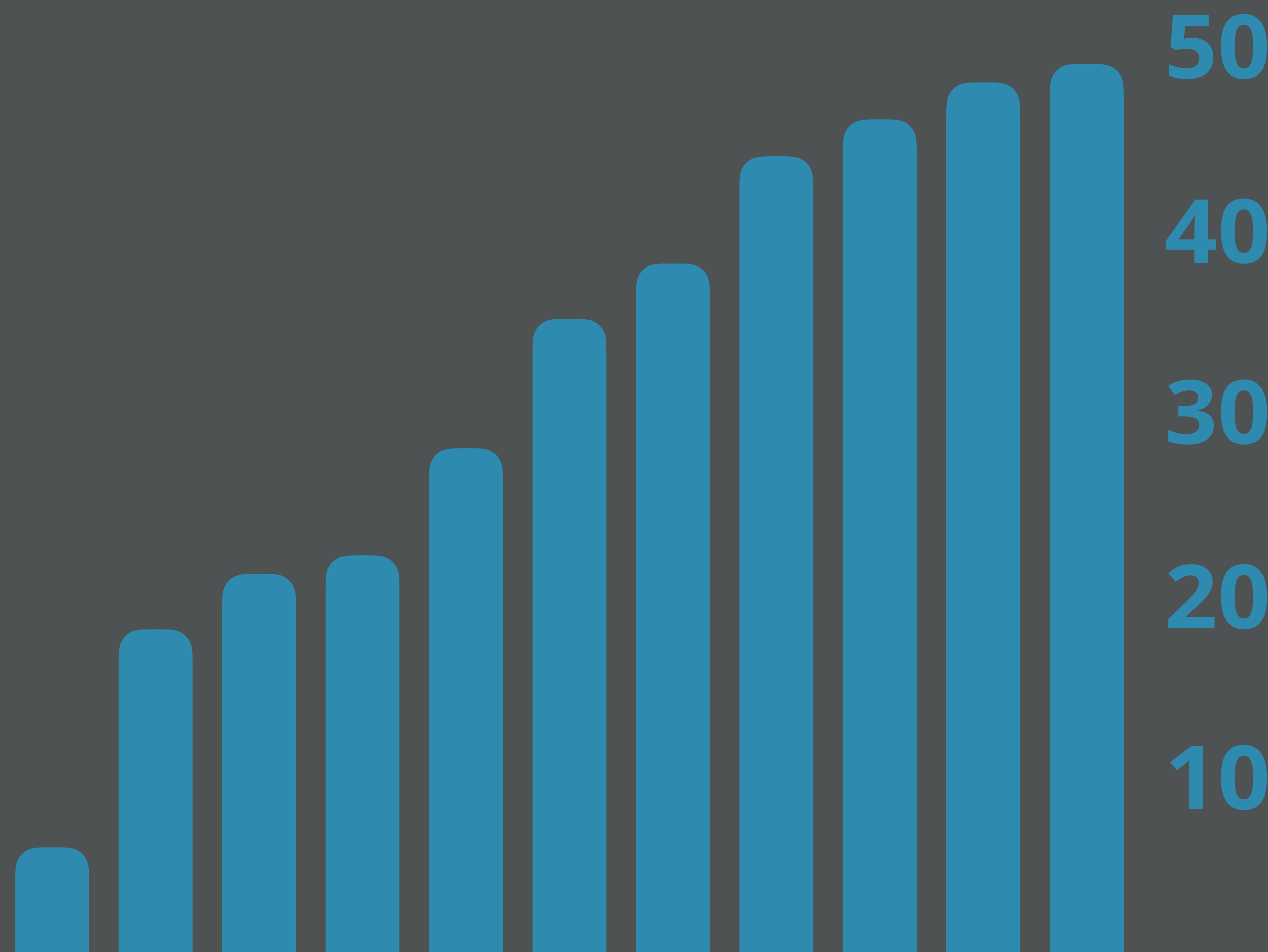

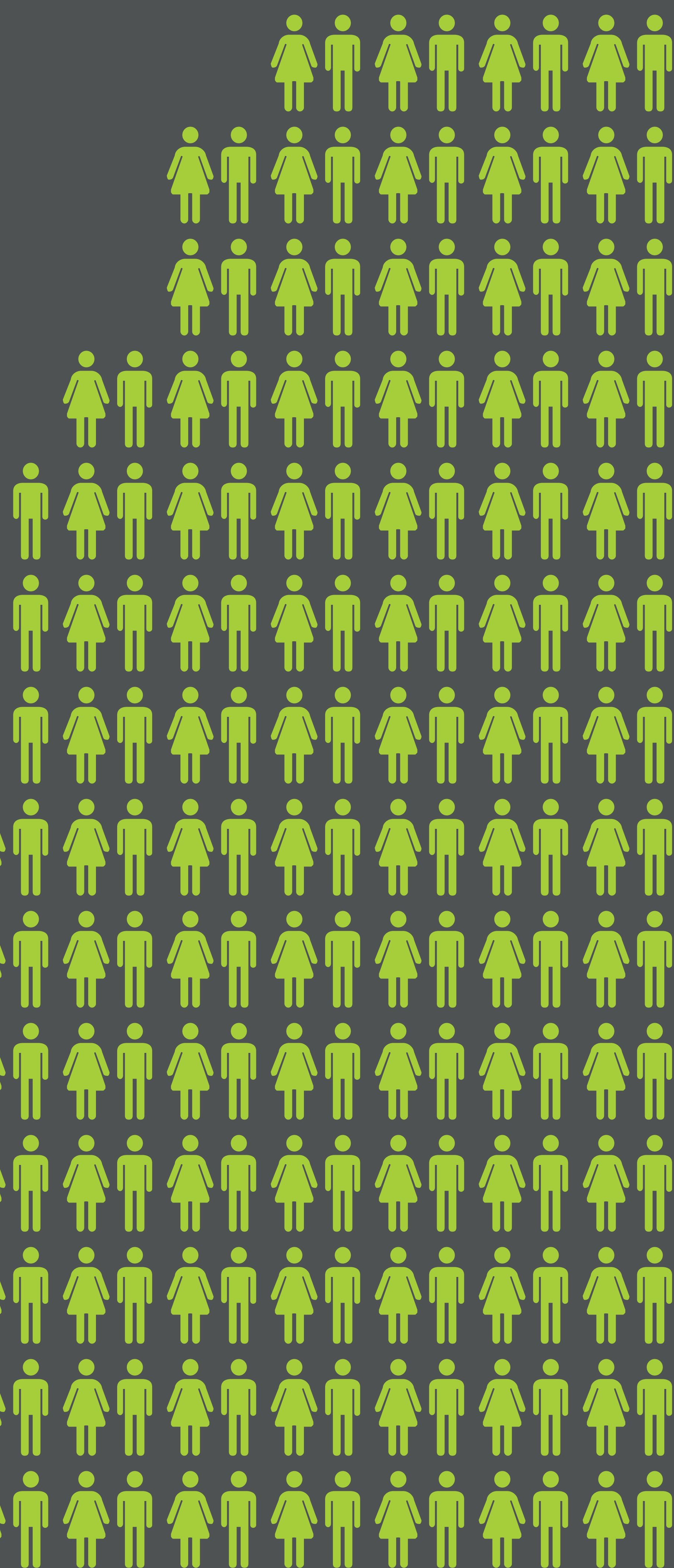

POSITION PAPER: AUTHOR IDENTIFICATION USING THE OPEN RESEARCHER AND CONTRIBUTOR ID

Based on the ORCID DE project this position paper is the result of the collaboration of three working groups of the German Initiative for Network Information (DINI) and is intended to provide institutions with both a strategic and a practical handbook.*

- The **NECESSITY** and **CHALLENGES** for the use of **AUTHOR IDENTIFICATION** in the scientific publication process are first described from the point of view of the various stakeholders involved.
- ORCID is presented as an example of a system for author identification and examined from **VARIOUS PERSPECTIVES** (e.g. history & legal aspects).
- The **APPROACHES** and **BENEFITS** of author identification using ORCID are finally discussed.
- **TECHNICAL ASPECTS** of the implementation of ORCID are examined before a final outlook is given on the **FUTURE DEVELOPMENT** of ORCID.
