I get a pension but it is not enough, with it I buy school uniforms for kids, food for everyone in the house. I struggled to divide this money to sustain this family. I don't even have a field or a garden because I am a newcomer here. There's no clean water, all I do is sell traditional drink to get something.

The money is not used for what it is intended to. Some children from poor families actually sleep here at the school, though we don't have a hostel. Some stay outside and sleep there and sometimes they go without food. We give them porridge for lunch and for some of them, that's the only meal they get in a day. Children stay far away lives here and they eat maize meal porridge with no sauce. Sometimes they buy sweet aid to put in the porridge to give it flavor. You know porridge from maize is really tasteless but people live off of it.
