- What is nestor – the German Network of Expertise in Digital Preservation?
 - a network fostering digital preservation in Germany and beyond ...
 - a network linking libraries, archives, museums ...
 - a network providing support for digital preservation in institutions
 - an open network that is in contact with many global players in the field of digital preservation

- ❑ What are the challenges of this endeavor?
 - ❑ There are aspects that are connected so that a clear answer is difficult to achieve
 - ❑ Asking for information about internal, sensitive topics for a network e. g. the financing
 - ❑ Topics with different cultural, legal or other characteristics e. g. bound to a region of the world

- Challenge 1: interconnected aspects - services of the network
 - Knowledge creation
 - Community building
 - Development of technology
 - Digital preservation as a service
 - Intersections are possible e. g. with topics of interest
 - ...

- Challenge 2: Asking for information about sensitive topics
- staffing the network
 - Persons employed by the network versus persons with voluntary input
 - Counting the FTE
 - Who can be considered to be “active” versus who is “passive”?
- Financing the network

- Challenge 3: Topics with different cultural, legal or other characteristics bound to a region
- Legal construction differs according to the legal system of the state: Non-profit organization, Association, Foundation ...
- The world is a big place and we know that we do not overview everything that may be important e. g. in other regions of the world
