

Transformation project “Haller online” (2016-2019)


- Transform the database-internal structure into a semantically modelled data structure (following the  guidelines)
- Keeping everything under control 
- Gradually opening the rich data corpus (goal: FAIR data)
- Setting the stage for the digital edition of Haller's correspondence and literary reviews
- Inviting thematically related projects to the platform

The “hallerNet” platform, launched in May 2019, is the most visible result of this transformation project: <https://hallernet.org>.

Enriching transcriptions with Metadata I

Where quality of earlier editions allows for it, the encodings are based on the printed editions (through either OCR, double keying or prepress files).

Print indices serve as a valuable source of knowledge. References to persons, places, institutions, works, topics and more may be extracted with a simple transformation after applying some styling to a digitised index.

¹ August Johann Hugo, a Hanoverian court physician since 1716, was currently attending the visiting King George II at Görde, near Lüneburg. Having earlier exchanged a few letters with Haller on botanical matters, he carried out the epistolary negotiations that brought him to Göttingen. In his letter to Johannes Geßner of 14 Dec., Haller mentions that he saw (in November) Hugo's beautiful botanical library and herbarium in Hanover.

Enriching transcriptions with Metadata II


The hallerNet transcription model employs three types of annotations:

- annotRef** Annotations that concern an object contained in the database
`<rs type="person/place/etc" key="{$ID}"><note type="annotRef"/></rs>`
- annotText** Textual annotations
`<note type="annotText">`
- annotFree** (Primarily historical) annotations that do not concern any specific object but e.g. the situation in which a letter was written
`<note type="annotFree">`
