1. Reflecting on user needs


- The Jisc RDM toolkit is a signposting service: readers (probably) don't need more RDM resources, but easier access.
- Resources are organised rationally: the research data lifecycle is a useful framework to do this.

...but how could we know this was right? We had 12 interviews with RDM experts before starting to draft and organise the material.
