(accordingly to opendoar.org)


#### The DSpace Committer Group



- Most decisions were run by the DSpace Committer Group
- Release were done using the "bring us what you have" principle
- Who contributed regularly was invited to join the DSpace Committer Group



#### Project governance




#### Repositories in Germany

- Until 2010 OPUS was the dominating software for repositories in Germany
- DSpace and EPrints were used in Germany, but not very often
- DSpace got a major thrive from 2014 onwards

approx. 25 attendees


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- First German DSpace User Group meeting in 2014
  - "informal exchange about typical topics of DSpace ... in Germany"




#### Why Germany's UG wanted to become a consortium...

- Being a growing group caring for DSpace (2014: 25, 2019: >100 participants)
- German user group was existing but missing a voice in project governance
- > Wanting to participate on determining the future of the software we need
- Membership fees oriented towards US-based universities
- But, if a single institution cannot afford a membership, can we finance it together?





#### Founding a national consortium


- ➢ 25 institutions founded the "DSpace Konsortium Deutschland" in 2018
- Surprisingly huge success:
  - The Consortium ended up with a platinum membership, being able to make a substantial contribution to finance the DSpace project
  - A representative from the Consortium is member of LG
  - One impact: LG started DSpace GDPR Working Group








## What did the UG find in DuraSpace?

- Always reachable contact person
- Being willing to listen, understand and learn about the local situation of DSpace user groups
- Introduced two new membership levels
- Accepted membership fees also in Euros, not only in US-Dollar
- Came to German User Group meetings
  - Was always appreciating work done locally



### What DuraSpace find in the German UG?

- One person willing to take responsibility and coordinate
- Community spirit: Learning from each other, helping out each other
- Organized Group: DSpace Anwendertreffen (2019 is the 6th edition)
- Understanding the benefits of contributing to an Open Source software
- > The will of being part of a global community representing country's needs
- Were actively asking for possibilities to engage within the existing community



# Lesson learned: There is no Community without personal engagement

- The community is not doing anything on its own. It's always individuals that are doing things for the community
- If you want the community to do something, you must help the community to be able to do so
- > Don't wait for the community to read your mind, go out and talk to them
- You did great stuff? Sharing your solutions is your best chance to get others to care for them

## Lesson learned: There is no Open Source Software without Community engagement

- > An Open Source Software without its community won't go anywhere
- Stimulate community engagement
- > Know your community: if it's global, you need to think and act accordingly
- Listen to local users and their needs
  - Be reachable
  - Respect differences
  - Be open to changes
- > Be open and transparent: with development, meetings, decision making
- Creating bridges and identifying common needs
